Trip Master Report.

uring our visit to the Norwalk & Western Railroad layout this spring, some of their members mentioned a club layout northwest of Toledo that we might be interested. Bonnie Lette was kind enough to look into the information given to her by the Norwalk group, which

has lead to my correspondence with their group about a possible visit. The Blissfield Model Railroad Club has built and operates a large HO scale model railroad with a focus on the Chesapeake & Ohio and Clinchfield railroads in northeastern Kentucky and western West Virginia. The 2300 square foot model railroad has over 1,500 feet of

mainline track on two primary levels. According to their website, "the layout is loosely based on a section of the Clinchfield Railroad and a portion of the C&O railroad in Appalachia in the 1955-1975 era. We generally try to run equipment of these railroads and time period during operating sessions, but all eras, as well as all equipment are welcome for running during open houses." The main line has mountain coal mines, a Kentucky steel mill, a major division point yard, a large engine facility, a river port, and many industries and scenes in between, with both single and double track mainlines, and passing sidings that allow running 16 foot trains. The layout occupies a





33 foot by 70 foot room, allowing us over 2300 square feet of operating space. The layout is basically a double deck, aroundthe-walls design with three large peninsulas extending into the center of the room. For those interested, they

will be having an open house to see the layout on Sept. 15-16, 2007. Depending on the Division 5 membership interest, we could schedule a visit either day. My preference would be on the Saturday, as we could also make a quick stop in Walbridge, Ohio and

surrounding area to see some CSXT action if anyone's interested. Walbridge is usually a very busy yard, although traffic may be better on a Saturday. Please let me know if you're interested in attending this trip ASAP and put it on your calendar. Although Sep-

tember may seem like quite a ways off, with summer vacations and trips and no meeting July, I would like to have an idea of how many members are interested in this trip. We will make arrangements to carpool up to their location or possibly rent a few vans. #



NMRA National Convention – July 22-28 – Division 4 bus is full for the one day trip for the vendor show – but you can still drive up for the day.

Steering Committee – Need someone to chair the committee – there are others willing to be on the committee but want someone to chair it – Rob Bowers volunteered to chair the Steering Committee. This committee will research all projects for the Division: i.e. Building, projects, cars, etc..

Company Store Ads in Magazines – the ads that Al has placed with the different magazines have started to generate purchases of the Reefers and Sugar Houses. Please get a copy of the ad from any of the following magazines to Al. Clerk Report - Bonnie Lette gave the Financial Balances of the accounts with the exception of Railfest.

Railfest – Rob reported that he has spoke with Matt to setup a time for the Audit to close the books for Railfest 2007.

AP Program Reported by Bill Brodie - Master Model Railroader #393 Gary Shaffer; at Lake Farm Park Rails in the Park – Bill received a Golden Spike application but has not heard anything yet.

Modules – signup sheet for those interested to be on the committee for the new modules was on the front table – if you did not sign up and would like to be on the committee, please contact Rick Montgomery. 1st committee meeting will be June 13, 2007 at Rick's office at 7:00 PM. Rick showed the hand drawn layout of the new proposed modules – it is tentatively going to go from Conneaut to Wickliffe. When a smaller layout is setup – we will lose Perry. Kirk Pohto has provided actual track plans. The track plan will be published in the Trainwire. It was mentioned that there is a new book out - Railroad Depots of Northeast Ohio thought it might help with the depots of the area. There was discussion about whether we needed to build new modules and why the new modules are deviating from the NMRA module standards. Various opinions, both pro and con, were expressed. One of the major reason for changing the size of the modules is for transporting the modules to be displayed; having them shorter, so they fit in the truck better, so there is less damage, the truck rental has discontinued the larger truck. Plans are to have computer interface with DCC.


The old modules will be retired but some of the landscape can be used on the new modules. Over all cost – stays within the budget. Discussed Modules vs Sectional layout – the new ones will be meeting better or closer then the current ones do to the NMRA standards. The old legs will be kept so the modules can be taller.

Currently there are 11 members signed up for the Module Committee – if interested to serve on the committee please contact Rick Montgomery. Cost of the new modules will be \$204.52 each before scenery.

Division 5 member Jack Burger died June 14, 2007.



Looks like an interesting and challenging modeling project if you have a couple of boxcars lying around. #

CF7Engine Sighting.

uring a recent trip to southern Kansas, I came across this Watco Company engine parked outside a small yard. Unfortunately it had little information on the body, just the reporting marks and engine number. little research on the web resulted in the unit being identified as a CF7, which is some-

thing I never had run across before. The CF7 was an EMD F-unit that has had its streamlined carbody removed and replaced with a custommade, "general purpose" body in order to adapt the unit for road switching duty. All of the conversions were performed by the Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway

in their Cleburne. workshops between October, 1970 and March, 1978. The CF7s worked within all segments of the Santa Fe system. While most saw action switching cars and transporting local freight, others could be found in multiple unit consists hauling mainline drags.₩
