

Rail Sightings.












When talking to RJ Corman workers I found out that there was several teams from all around, Pittsburgh, Columbus, Toledo, and Jacksonville Florida.

Alternative for Constructing Main Street Buildings


ooking for a cheap way to increase the number of buildings within your town setting? The Illinois Historic Preservation Agency has a website which offers HO scale models of various historic buildings which can be found in Illinois towns. They currently offer plans for 10 build-

ings, consisting of several office or commercial buildings, banks, or retail establishments. All of the buildings are produced in the .pdf format, and include a brief description of the structure as well as assembly instructions and a final picture. The .pdf file contains a complete building, including side and back walls, as well as a roofline. To make a building, it's as easy printing the .pdf file onto heavy cardstock paper, followed by gluing and assembling the building. If you want a slightly sturdier building as I did, print the building to regular paper and then glue it onto a styrene sheet with thickness of your choice. For my purposes, I had some left over 0.010-inch styrene that made the building quite sturdy. If you only want part of the building, you can By: Kenneth Stroebel

decide how much of the sidewall is needed, and then produce a partial building which projects outward from your wall. And if you don't need a 3-dimensional building, the front of the building can be attached to your back wall to give a background. http://www.buildyourownmainstre et.com/
