June 5, 2009

Superintendent Al Cap called the meeting to order at 7:30 pm at Hambden Town Hall. Approximately 31 members and 3 guests were present.

Al Cap gave us an update on Div 5 member Jack Metcalf's health status and new nursing home location.

Some recent communications from other groups were reviewed. One item was about a prototype streetcar being auctioned off because the historical society could not generate enough interest or funds to restore it.

It was reported that the Railfest 2009 financial books had been reconciled and reviewed.

The Division 4 sponsored trip to Cass, WV was announced again. People interested were encouraged to check out Div 4's website for details. Trip dates are Oct 16 - 18.

The 2011 Convention Committee will meet at Harley Smith's house on June 6.

Mike Buehner indicated that he is having trouble getting people to respond to our layout survey and Fall Layout Tour event.

Dale Smith is exploring the possibility of a Division picnic at the home Dick Naramore in Jefferson, OH with an evening ride on the AC&J. This would probably be an August event.

We had five Division members go to the operating session on Lou Mallard's layout in Erie, PA on May 30. We had ten members go to the operating session on Dave Eggleston's layout in Jamestown, NY on May 9.

Treasurer Bonnie Lette read off the account balances for the various Division funds. All of our bills are paid and we are solvent.

Bruce Lutheran and Dale Smith reported on Promo Day 2009 planning. We had to drop the idea of using the Lakeland Community College gymnasium this year due to various issues. The location has been changed to the Mentor Headlands Senior Center. We will be cutting back from what we were planning to do. We will be presenting clinics instead of trying to build an actual layout. We will try again in 2010 to use Lakeland and do our proposed layout building demonstrations.

Gary Shaffer is looking at some possible bus trips for the Division. The members present were asked for ideas of places they would like to visit. The following are some of the ideas presented: Warthers Museum / Sugar Creek, Timonium Trainshow, Strasburg, Oil Creek & Titusville RR, East Broad Top RR, Steamtown, Harrisburg Tower, ride the Pittsburgh RTA.

Bill Eville reported that he is working on a new HO module frame design and locking at better ideas for locking modules together.

The Western Reserve Model Railroad Museum is now operating under its summer hours schedule.

The Mid Central Region is offering a new laser cut kit as a fund raiser for our region. It is a Crew Locker

Dale has gone to a convention there in the past and he said it was well done. This is part of the North Central Region, not our Mid Central Region. Dale has a CD available that describes the convention.

Division 5 BOD Meeting Notes

June 15, 2009

Present: Al Cap, Dale Smith, Bonnie Lette, Wayne Lette, Don Bittner, Mike Buehner, Matt Kross, Lenny Kessler, Jim Wendorf, and Rob Bowers.

Reviewed upcoming events, Bring & Brag themes, and meeting programs. The Bring & Brag theme for August will be "Water". Anything related to water with respect to model railroading can be brought in. This could be a scene with some type of water feature, an online water tower, water troughs between the rails for steam engines equipped with water scoops, residential or industrial water towers, boats, railroad car ferries, etc.

The 2011 Convention Committee is ready to sign a contract with The Lodge And Conference Center At Geneva to use as our convention facility. The Lodge has presented us with reasonable pricing and offers a very nice facility for our convention. The committee would like to do a number of things to really advertise and promote the convention. Motions were passed to provide the 2011 Convention Committee with the following cash advances from the Division: \$500 for the convention facility deposit, up to \$350 to purchase pens imprinted with the convention name, date, and location to use for advertising, and \$40 to register the website domain name www.RailsOfAges.org for two years.



Division 5 BOD Meeting Notes cont.....

June 15, 2009

The BOD had a lengthy discussion regarding what to do with the HO modules. The Western Reserve Model Railroad Museum will be moving to a new location in the Fall and the museum needs to know if the Division wants to rent storage space for the HO modules at the museum as we have been doing. The BOD would prefer to have the HO modules on display when not being used for a specific, limited event such as Railfest or Farmpark setups. The museum did not provide any information about being able to set up the modules for display so Al Cap will contact them to see what their requirements would be. The BOD discussed other HO module storage alternatives such as PODS or SOS containers, purchasing a large trailer, or just having the module owners return to storing their own modules. The PODS option would require the container to be stored in Streetsboro, Ohio and the delivery/pickup fees would be in the \$150 range for an event. The SOS container storage is in Eastlake and so the delivery/pickup fee would be lower (\$20 plus a mileage fee). The SOS monthly rental fee is about the same as PODS. The SOS container is better suited for us to build custom racks in the container to hold the modules. In addition, we would have some access to the container at the storage facility. No definite pricing was available for the cost of a trailer big enough to suit our needs. It was estimated that the cost would be around \$5,000 for a 16 ft long trailer. Wayne Lette will get more detailed pricing. The BOD tabled the issue until we find out what the museum would charge to allow us to have the modules set up for display and also whether there is enough interest to continue supporting the modules.

Dale Smith reported on Promo Day 2009 planning. We have a signed contract with the Mentor Headlands Community Center to use their facility for the event on November 7th. The facility has a 38 ft x 44 ft hall with a 12 ft x 12 ft stage plus a dining area that we can use for refreshments.

The BOD decided that an actual audit of the Railfest 2009 books should be done instead of just a financial account reckoning and general review, especially since there has been a change in chairman. The Division auditors will be contacted.

Lenny Kessler will be the Assistant Railfest Chairman, assisting Jim Wendorf, the new Railfest Chairman.

After reviewing the costs of Railfest 2009 and projected cost increases for next year, Jim Wendorf recommended that we increase both the table fees and the gate fees starting next year. A motion was passed to increase the table fees by \$3 (8ft table will cost \$48 and a 6ft table will cost \$36). A motion was passed to raise all the current gate fees by \$2. Basic Adult admission will now be \$7. This is in line with other trainshows of comparable size.

A motion was passed to register the following website domain name <u>www.Railfest.org</u> at a cost of \$20 a year. We will then set up a webpage dedicated to Division 5's Railfest.

Next **BOD** meeting will be July 20, 2009 at Hambden Town Hall at 7:30 pm.

Condolences To The Jack Metcalf Family.




ongtime Division 5 died on June 13, 2009. Jack was active with the HO modules and always took care of the coffee at Railfest. Jack's



Convention Facility

We have decided to hold our convention at The Lodge & Conference Center At Geneva-On-The-Lake, Ohio. The Lodge is a beautiful facility that was built in 2005. It is located on Rt. 534, north of Geneva, Ohio, on the shore of Lake Erie. It is a true conference center and so it has the meeting rooms we need to put on a convention. We will be able to have the convention banquet here. We have the space we need for three clinic rooms, contest room, silent auction room, company store and raffle room, and possibly some space for some small modular layouts. 
