No new information on **Promo Day 2010**. Promo Day clinicians will provide short summaries of their presentations at the September and October Division 5 meetings.





very city needs food. So where there is a city, somewhere on the outskirts of that city you will find a packing plant. The Walthers Champion Packing Company is an excellent model for just such a setting. It is a large multi-story building with an elevated cattle chute on the back of the building that wraps around a separate boiler house. The model also comes with a large smoke stack. The two buildings, smoke stack and cattle chute occupy 123 square inches. The packing house models were fairly simple to assemble and detail, but the cattle chute wrapped too tightly around the boiler house and I had to put in a little extension so that trucks could access the large doors on the side that would have been blocked by the chute. The stockyard by Walthers on the other hand, contained numerous parts, too many to count. The plans were just an exploded view of the model, a scratch builder's delight. The model covers an additional 104 square inch foot print. If you do the math, you can see that your layout will need at least 227 square inches to accommodate this model.



The four pictures above show the finished Model. The first two are the four story building (front and back). The third picture is the boiler house and the forth picture is the stockyard. The stockyard is comprised of two pens with loading chutes that align with 40' cattle cars. In addition to the two railroad chutes, there is a loading and unloading chute to accommodate trucks. There is also a lean-to for shelter or feeding. The bottom three pictures show where the models will eventually end up on the layout. There are plenty of intricate details on both roofs. The stockyard has many working gates and I covered the base with sawdust. Once again I painted and weathered both models as I assembled them. Once again, I can't tell you how many hours were spent on these two models but that's the difference between a modeler and a time keeper. This too was a fun model to build and it will be an interesting industry on my layout. The rail cars that you would probably find around this building would be plenty of cattle cars and refrigerator cars with an occasional flatcar or gondola. This is one of my latest projects, what are you working on?
