

A **Division 5 BOD meeting** was held on October 14, 2013 at Hambden Town Hall. In attendance were: Rob Bowers, Dave Neff, Bonnie Lette, Wayne Lette, Matt Kross, Bob Frieden, Bob Gittinger, Tom Pescha, Don Bittner, Dennis Lloyd, Ted Wiese, and Lenny Kessler.

Rob Bowers and Dave Neff reviewed highlights of the recent **Mid Central Region BOD meeting**. One item that was directly related to Division 5 was the request by one NMRA member to move the Solon zip code from Division 4 to Division 5. NMRA members in that zip code turned down this move, so it will remain in Division 4.

**Division 6** is offering track cleaning blocks to other divisions as a money making project. It is like a Bright Boy but made of a softer material so that it buffs the rails instead of abrasively cleaning them. There are two per pack. Selling prices are \$5 N, \$6 HO, and \$8 O. There is a minimum order quantity. Rob Bowers and Dave Neff are going to try the samples they were given and report back to the BOD whether they think we should proceed with purchasing some of these for sale in our Division 5 company store.

It was reported that the **Division 4 train show** had record attendance this year.

**Division 5** did not sign up any new members at the Division 4 NMRA table this year.

The December Bring & Brag will not have a theme, so anything goes!

The **Division 5 Holiday Party** will be either Friday January 10 or Saturday January 11. 2014.

Rob presented an idea for a **diorama challenge**. He is going to take the program done by another division and rewrite it for what he is proposing for Division 5.

We need **meeting programs** for 2014. Dave Neff is going to see if there are people in Division 1 and Division 4 that would like to present clinics they plan to put on for the 2014 convention.

Tom Pescha, Rob Bowers, and Bob Frieden reported on how the **Great Lakes Mall Kidgits** event went. Tom had a small Lionel layout there that the kids loved. There was interest from the parents but no definite leads.

The **Division 5 and Railfest** financial audits were completed. No problems were found.

The Lake Erie N-scale Society (LENS) presented a report on their **Return Loop Module Project** that Division 5 helped fund. The project was very successful and will allow the club to set up in smaller locations and to do one day setups. The project got many club members involved and was used to teach new members various techniques involved with building modules.

No report has been received to date from the **Painesville Depot** group regarding how the funds they received from Division 5 were used.

**LENS** submitted a funding request for a DCC control system for their modular layout. So far, no other groups have submitted funding requests for 2014.

It was noted that we need to have a **spare bulb** on hand for our **video projector**. Wayne to look into the cost.

The BOD reviewed a rough draft of the **proposed 2014 budget**. A few modifications were made, but in general, the proposed budget was acceptable. There is one month left for budget adjustments to be made. The final version of the 2014 Div 5 budget will be approved at the November 2013 BOD meeting. Decisions regarding what outside funding requests the BOD will grant will be made at the Feb 2014 BOD meeting.

# Railfanning Road Trip

hat a great day for a road trip. On the second day of October the NETS model railroad group went on its first road trip. The morning was a little overcast but the temperature was in the lower seventies. Our destination was the Berea Union Depot Taverne for lunch and some up close and personal railfanning. From the restaurant in addition to a good lunch, we could observe the Norfolk Southern tracks which were less than one hundred yards away. Of course nothing was more exciting than a high ball CSX train thundering past the windows within twenty-five feet of the restaurant. The Berea Union Depot was a significant hub in the railroad networks of northeast Ohio from the time of its construction in 1876 until its closing in 1958. The thick walls of the



unique Victorian Gothic Architecture were constructed using local sandstone from an expanding stone quarry industry in the Berea area. From 1958 until 1980, the building remained closed until it began a second life, restored as a restaurant and gathering place. Today the restaurant is under the management of the Union Depot Taverne and with the relative distance from the tracks it provides an exceptional dining experience. After lunch we returned to the parking lot under a clear and bright sky, set up our camp chairs and enjoyed two hours of train watching before returning to the eastside. I personally enjoyed our first road trip and look forward to many more in the future.





# Midwest Railway Preservation Society Open House Visit



n Sept 14, 2013 Dan Chuppa, Wayne and myself went to West 3<sup>rd</sup> Street to the B&O Roundhouse to the open house of the Midwest Railway Preservation Society. It was a nice sunny cool day to enjoy trains and history. We took the guided tour around the roundhouse and a short ride on the Pullman Mt. Baxter car. We learned how the machine shop worked and the different machines they use to make the parts they need to do their restorations. The reason they need to fabricate some parts, is that they are for the older cars and locomotives, and are not available to purchase. They have a pattern room for making the molds and patterns necessary for parts needed. They can recreate molds of original and cast new metal items.

The caboose was the next item on the tour to see and hear the history of this particular caboose. Our tour guide showed us how the knuckle coupler worked and air hoses. Explaining the braking system and how the coupler would not uncouple even if the pin or parts inside the coupler broke as long as there was pulling pressure kept, but as soon as it was relaxed the coupler would fall apart.

While walking through we saw many rows of older cars that the society has acquired and will be restoring as time and money allows. One car I found very interesting was a refrigerated Fruit Growers Express car. It is the first time



that I can remember seeing how thick the doors and car walls were. This car would have the ends filled with ice and compartmentalized with fans to distribute the cool air to keep the produce fresh. The fans ran from generators on the trucks of the car. The railroad would put these trains on the green light and even the passenger trains waited for the produce trains to come through as the railroad did not want to pay for the spoilage.

During the short train ride on the property, we learned the history of the porter and how the Pullman car was used. This particular car was a first class sleeper. If you purchased the seat facing the forward direction of the train not only did you pay more but you got to sleep on the bottom bed. If you purchased the seat facing backward you would save money but needed to sleep in the top pull down bed which needed a latter to get in and out of. If you needed to use the facilities, you would ring a doorbell and the porter would come with the ladder to let you down and wait till you returned for you to go to bed again. The Porter would work as many hours as needed to keep their passengers happy.

So they might only get as little as 3 hours of sleep in a day.

One car on the property was different. It as an open hopper and was painted with "US Marines – Toys for Tots". The society used this car one year for their Toys for Tots campaign. Our guide told us that over 3,000 people came to fill the car with toys.

The turntable is in the process of being renovated as the wooden parameter structure is rotting away and is being replaced with concrete. We were told that when the turntable was in balance it would take only a few guys to turn it with a loco on it. The roundhouse was originally 10 stalls and then 5 more were added. Because of some of the structural beams were knocked down, some of the stalls fell. The Society has done many repairs to the roof and structure but much more is needed. The 4070 is being restored. Plus there were two Amtrak cars being restored. One of these cars was used by President Jimmy Carter during his whistle stop ride from Georgia to Washington DC. The movie played during the trip was "Silver Streak."

The Society is a 501c3 organization, has 7 employees and many volunteers. It is a very interesting place to visit and I would recommend going to one of their open houses.


