





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Division 5 Meeting Minutes

December 6, 2013

Meeting was called to order by Superintendent Rob Bowers at 7:30 pm at Hambden Town Hall. There were 25 members and 4 guests present.

Three people at the meeting said they had not received their mailed paper copy of the Trainwire. It was noted that you can always go to the website and get a copy. If you don't have a computer or internet access, ask a friend to print you a copy or go to the library and use the computer there.

Members' Questions:

It was asked why the recent MCR Kingpin did not have a report published in the minutes. The answer was because the Division 5 Superintendent did not submit a written report but instead gave a verbal report at the meeting. Only the written reports were published.

It was asked what type of **registration acknowledgement** should be expected for the 2014 convention. People had received a brief e-mail saying their registration was received but have not heard about any other details. The answer was that the convention details are still being worked on. It is believed that tour and event sign-ups will be available in January. Those that have already registered will be notified first as soon as this is available so that they get first crack at signing up.

Rob Bowers presented a few ideas about **the diorama contest** that he would like to do. The idea is anything you can do in 144 square inches. Winner would be by popular vote. This event would not replace our regular Bring & Brag. There were a number of questions and alternate ideas presented. This activity needs to be better defined and the rules published in the Trainwire. It wasn't clear whether the membership wanted to participate in this type of contest.

A Railfest 2014 planning update was provided. There will be a dinner Saturday evening after the show closes at Dino's Restaurant next to the college. Don Wetzel will be the speaker and talking about the NYC jet powered train experiment. Railfest will also be offering the box lunches again for the exhibitors. Some new rules by the college with regards to setup and room layout will affect us some. We will not be able to have as many exhibits in the lobby area.

Discussed the model railroad display activities at **Lake Farmpark** during the month of December for their Country Lights event. Lots of volunteer help is needed.



Railfanning in Cresson, Pa

hat could be better than hitting the road on a beautiful autumn day? Hitting the road with members of the **NETS**

group in the middle of the week and arriving at the **Station Inn** in Cresson Pennsylvania. In addition to rooms that are simple, spotless, and bright, your

breakfast is included in your room rate. Great rail fanning can be viewed from the lounge area, the large front porch and up close and personal on both sides of the mainline tracks that are right across the street from the Inn. The opposite side of the tracks is accessible through an underpass tunnel right in front of the building. The front porch provides an







excellent wide angle view for rail fanning and it has an interesting array of automobile license plates mounted on one of the walls. The Inn is not the easiest place to get around for the handicapped, but it is doable. This area is near Altoona and right around the corner from the famous Horseshoe Curve which is known for some serious and enjoyable rail fanning. There are numerous attractions in the area including The Horseshoe Curve, The Altoona Railroad Memorial Museum and The Allegheny Portage Railroad National Historic Site. There are plenty of photo opportunities in Cresson which combines the quaintness of small town Pennsylvania and the raw power of diesel rail-roading. Our party of three was able to visit The Horse-shoe Curve which opened February 15, 1854 and was engineered by J. Edgar Thompson. It is located at (Continued on page 5)



Kittanning Point, at the base of the Allegheny Mountains. The construction of the Curve was done by about 450 workers, many of them from Ireland. The work was done entirely by hand, and workers

were paid 25 cents per hour for a twelve hour day. We also made the trip to Altoona and saw the numerous buildings related to the railroad industry. Unfortunately the Railroad Museum was closed for the season except on weekends. The observation area of the Horseshoe Curve was also closed for the season but we still were able to experience the magnificence of this incredible engineering achievement. On the third day of our trip, we were able to retrace most of the incline planes of the **Allegheny Port**- **age Railroad.** It was the first railroad to circumvent the Allegheny Mountains and was the finishing piece of the Pennsylvania Mainline Canal. "The Portage," opened in 1834, marking the first time that there was one direct route between Philadelphia and








Pittsburgh. It was all things to all people; it served merchants, passengers, slaves in pursuit of freedom, and soldiers from the Mexican War. It reduced a 24 day journey by wagon down to a 4 day trip. The system only

lasted twenty years as it became unprofitable when the Pennsylvania railroad completed its all rail line from Philadelphia to Pittsburgh. There is plenty to do and see but as with all sightseeing vacations, this one was too short. There's no doubt some day I will return and hopefully it will be with more members of the NETS group. We had perfect weather on our three day excursion, but the end of October is not the best time to

visit this vibrant area of the country. The next time I travel to this region, it will be earlier in the year when the daylight hours are longer. The affordable trip was well worth the endeavor and worth repeating.







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Division 5 Election Process

The following are excerpts from our Division 5 Regulations explaining the election process:

The Division Nominating Committee shall be appointed by the Superintendent. It shall be composed of a Chairperson and two other members. Each person on the committee shall be from a different county of the Division. The current Superintendent shall not serve on the committee, nor sit with it during its deliberations. The Nominating Committee will report the nominations to the Clerk and the membership.

Members of the **Nominating Committee** may not nominate themselves for any office, including re-election for office.

The **Teller** shall report the results of the election to the officers of the Division and to all nominees prior to the May meeting. The results are to be announced by the Teller at the May meeting. Those elected shall be invited to participate in the May Board of Directors meeting. The newly elected officers will assume office June 1st.

Nominations for Division 5 offices may be made by a petition signed by two members and the nominee and submitted to the Nominating Committee. The signatures must be legible and the member's NMRA membership number and their membership expiration date must appear with the signature. The petition shall state for what office the candidate is seeking nomination. No candidate can be nominated for more than one office in an election.

Nominations from the Nominating Committee shall be presented at the January meeting of the election year. Nominations of members from the floor shall be presented at the February meeting of the election year. Nominations from the floor shall be by a motion and must be seconded. Nominees cannot nominate themselves.

No member shall be nominated to an elective office without their approval.

Election for **Division officers** shall be conducted by mail ballot. Nominees for office and qualifications for same shall be included in the March issue of the <u>Trainwire</u> for elected office balloting.




