



The Historic Railroad Exhibit at Century Village

ecently, Rich and I visited Century Village in Burton, Ohio, where we saw the historic 1878 Aultman depot, B&O caboose C316, and a narrow-gauge train on the grounds (Figs. 1-3). We became interested in the history of the exhibit, and especially the original location of the depot. When I began researching the history of the station while it was in Aultman, however, I found conflicting data on railroad stations in the area and was intrigued by old newspaper headlines from the

Canton Repository that read "The Death of a Village" and "The Vanished Black Community of Aultman". On my journey for information, I even went on an armchair round-trip ride on the Valley Railway between Cleveland and Canton—in 1880! As I "rode" through Aultman, I saw the train depot, several thriving industries, and a siding that led to a coal bank, courtesy of the Guide Book for Tourists and Travelers over the Valley Railway from Cleveland to Canton Ohio, 1880, facsimile copy reprinted in 2002 in cooperation with the

Cuyahoga Valley National Park and the Cuyahoga Valley Scenic Railroad.

The village of Aultman (population 1000 at its peak), which straddled the county line between Stark and Summit counties, no longer exists (Fig. 4). The 1878 Aultman (Greentown) station was located south of the intersection of the railroad and Greensburg Rd. in Summit County on the west side of the track in Aultman (Fig. 5). (Greensburg Rd. changes to State St. in Stark County at

Aultman Rd., which runs parallel to the railroad track.) It was the station that served Greentown, which is up the hill 3/4 mile to the east in Stark County and Greensburg 2-1/2 miles to the west in Summit County. By 1895 the Valley Railway became part of the Cleveland Terminal and Valley Railroad (Fig. 6), and in 1915 it was purchased by the B&O Railroad. The railroad serviced




Fig. 8 NATCO Company House

local industries in Aultman, mostly located in Stark County, including the Valley Sewer Pipe and Fire Brick Works and the Tile and Conduit Works (Fig. 7), which were later sold to the National Fireproofing Co. (NATCO). NATCO employed 500 people at its prime, recruiting workers from the south and providing them with company houses called "square" and "round" (Fig. 8), possibly made of silos manufactured by

NATCO. When concrete conduits became cheaper to produce, business diminished over a 30-year period until the company went bankrupt in 1963. By then, most of the people had moved out of Aultman to find new employment. The facility and houses were all torn down shortly after the bankruptcy, and nothing remains in the area today.

The B&O station (Fig. 9), which was formerly the hub of the businesses in town, was unused and scheduled to be torn down in 1967. After some negotiations, the B&O Railroad offered the station free to the Geauga County Historical Society and even transported it to Middlefield at no cost, but members of the GCHS plus ten Amish carpenters had to first disassemble the station in Aultman and load it into available railroad cars (Figs. 10-11). The dismantled station was lost in transit, and weeks passed before the cars were found on a siding in Middlefield. The pieces had been mistaken for rubbish by yard workers. The Geauga County maintenance department transferred the "debris" to the museum grounds. Another three years passed before it was

reconstructed from memory, because no blueprints or plans were available. The caboose on display was added to the exhibit in 1971 (Fig. 12). It is from series C-1-C399, Class C-1, initial GCZ, number 316, and was one of 109 cabooses built between 1913 and 1918 by the B&O Railroad. It was purchased in Chillicothe, Ohio and moved to Middlefield by rail. From there the caboose was transported to Century Village in Burton on two flat-bed trailer trucks. Unfortu-

nately, the planned addition of an engine and railcars to the new attraction never materialized. Century Village is open daily and is free to walk the grounds and see the exhibit

Afterthought: A village comprising a major tile industry with kilns, unusual company houses, a siding to a coal bank, and a large grain elevator, plus two railroads (the B&O and the Wheeling and Lake Erie) and the interurban (Northeast Ohio Traction & Light Co., later renamed Northeast Ohio Power & Light) going through the surrounding area, would make this an interesting model railroad layout.

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




