Superintendent's Report

Model Railroad Fiction and Fantasy

e're all familiar with some pristine and precision model railroads and railroaders within our hobby. You know, 'rivet and prototype counters' modelers who wouldn't be caught dead with a nonprototypical freight car on their layout. Why, even in N scale we have peculiar rolling stock collectors who refuse to open an unused, new model in its plastic box lest fresh air begin to deteriorate the little sucker or some such.

Fortunately, not many of us fall into this category. Our model railroads are ours, to exist primarily for our own enjoyment, and we all have learned that there is probably an actual prototype for almost anything we wish to populate our layouts with. It's also easy to invent and imagine some strange scenario. Fiction and fantasy are every bit a cornerstone of this hobby as well as true-tolife replication of actual railroading.

Case in point----Broadway Limited is now coming out later this year with N scale livestock cars with sound, as they have in the larger scales. But not in my favorite road names, as I'm trying to loosely base my home pike on the Pocahontas Roads—C & O, N & W, Virginian. I have a slaughterhouse/packing plant structure on my layout, and am featuring hogs as livestock rather than cattle. Hogs were common in this region fairly especially in Virginia. Think Virginia ham. The new livestock cars with sound have mostly *western* road-names, and ones like Dubuque Packing. Not exactly appropriate for the West Virginia/Virginia region. But they do have a hog-sound car decorated for the Pennsy. How do I fit that one in? Very simply, this is where creative thinking takes over. You see, there are choices which can satisfy the usual question of the purist who says "why do you have a Pennsy cattle car on your layout"? Two choices for answers: (1) the car is leased; (2) there was excess slaughter house/

packing plant capacity so the company brought in some 'Pennsylvania' hogs!

You get the idea—we can create our own reality, virtually 'anything goes' in our little empires. Even model-building 'mistakes' have their place---the real world isn't perfect. So be creative, be flexible, have fun. Helps keep us sane, off the streets and out of the bars---but don't try to get too far off-track! - Dave Neff



Special BOD Meeting

April 30, 2015

A **special meeting** of the Division 5 BOD was held on April 30, 2015 at Lake Farmpark in Kirtland, OH at 7:30 pm to discuss the opportunity of sponsoring the Lincoln Funeral Train Display. In attendance were Dave Neff, Dale Smith, Bonnie Lette, Wayne Lette, Matt Kross, Bob Gittinger, Jim Wendorf, Tom Pescha, Rob Bowers, Don Bittner, and Lenny Kessler.

Overview: For the 150th anniversary of President Lincoln's death, a group has created replicas of the Lincoln Funeral Car and the locomotive that pulled the funeral train. They are taking this display around to various cities. We have the opportunity to bring this display to the Painesville Depot on June 6 - 7th, 2015. However, there are significant costs involved in hosting the display (cost of equipment transportation, travel and lodging expenses for the display crew, creation of an area to set the equipment, insurance, etc.). Tom Pescha has been working furiously to line up sponsors and donations. We have a number of companies/organizations that are willing to donate money, advertising, construction work, etc. Division 5 will need to be the primary sponsor at a cost of around \$14,000. An entrance fee will be charged and so at least some of the cost of this event can be recovered.

This opportunity came about less than a week ago and a decision needs to be made very quickly in order for us to get on the display schedule.

The BOD spent a considerable amount of time discussing all aspects of the project: budget, grants/donations, parking, advertising, food, logistics, ticket prices, insurance, permits, hours, volunteer tasks, IRS regulations on how the Division's money can be spent, site requirements, split of revenues received, etc.

The following motion was passed by the BOD: Division 5 will proceed with being the primary sponsor (up to a maximum of \$14,000) of the Lincoln Funeral Train Display on June 6-7, 2015 at the Painesville Depot with profits returned to the sponsors in proportion to their level of investment.

The Treasurer will obtain an NMRA insurance certificate for the event listing the Painesville Depot as the host location.

Many thanks to Tom Pescha for an incredible amount of leg work, phone calls, and arm twisting in a very short amount of time to bring this event together. Tom generated a very detailed event plan that covered the majority of the questions that the BOD had. He was also able to wrangle a number of very helpful donations.



Division 5 Semi-annual Report to MCR BODMay 7, 2015

Division 5 is comprised of Lake, Geauga, and Ashtabula counties in Northeastern Ohio. Membership rolls as communicated by NMRA national show just over 100 paid members. Our average monthly 'event' attendance is 30-35---but usually many of the very same individuals each month.

We continue to have successful Bring 'n Brag session with very good participation by members displaying items in all scales—Z, N, HO, S, O and narrow gauge.

In early November, our 'Build a Model Railroad' event, free to the public, drew good attendance and many of our members participated with 'topic' stations such as discussing and displaying benchwork, scenery, track-laying, electrical, structure building, trees, etc. We also have operating layouts at this event. We've gained

new members here also.

Our annual Railfest, held in mid-March at Lakeland Community College, continues to be one of the most successful model railroading 'event's in the state. Our revenues from this event fully fund our operating budget for the year, and our bank balance is very healthy.

Programs on modeling techniques have been solicited from our Division members and also from neighboring Divisions. The fledgling NMRA Edu-Train program should also generate opportunities for additional clinic-type programs. Several of our members have operating sessions on a monthly basis, and trips are planned in the next few months to operating sessions in Western New York.

Division 5 is sponsoring the replica Lincoln Funeral Train coming to the Painesville, Ohio Depot June 6-7. This will be open to the public, with a modest admission charge. Funds to cover the major cost for this event were generated by the shared revenues coming to the Division from the 2014 NMRA National Convention held in Cleveland.

Our annual Division picnic will be held Aug. 8 at the Painesville Depot.
