Superintendent's Report

Musings

ere we are in mid-May and finally the weather has turned nice. But I can't say I really did a lot of good modeling during the previous three weeks when the temperature stayed in the 50's with mostly rain where it was not feasible to be outside. What counties should be included?

Modeling Question: How to eliminate wear and tear on the axles of Walthers HO passenger cars? Problems with axle length shortening after extension running. Various lubrications have been tried without success. One suggestion was to use a nylon bearing insert made by Tichy.

Encouraged members in the PA and NY counties to consider opening their layouts for the Fall 2017 Division 5 layout tours.

Discussed the grant request from the **Lakeshore Model Railroad Association** for \$500. Reviewed the report the LMRA provided regarding what they spent last year's grant money on along with photos of the purchases and work in progress. Grant request was approved.

Discussed upcoming **membership meeting in Erie, PA.** The LMRA will host the meeting. They have an HO car for sale as a money raising project. There will be one layout open for members to visit after the meeting. During the meeting, there will be a discussion about what it would take to form a new division within the Mid Central Region for the former members of the Allegheny Highlands Division.

The next regular **Division 5 BOD** meeting will be June 13, 2017 at 7:30pm at Hambden Town Hall.



Bob was an avid model railroader; he participated in Tuesday Night Trains for forty-seven years and attended national railroad conventions; traveled across the US on

Amtrak, enjoying the beauty of the country along the way. He was also a sports enthusiast and yearly traveled to Columbus, Ohio to watch the girl's state basketball tournaments. Bob was a generous blood donor, and donated over 5 gallons to the American Red Cross. He believed giving blood was a great humanitarian aid. He often challenged others to go with him and give the gift of life. He is survived by his wife of 52 years, Kay Palmer; son, Scott (Marilyn) Palmer of Tampa, Fla.; daughter, Kimberly (Darren) Cook of Waterford, Pa.; and grandchildren, Corwin, Morgan, Gabriella, Sydney, Kathryn, Robert, and Owen. 
Division 5 Loses a Legend

arley D. Smith, age 89, a longtime resident of Hambden Twp., died on Tuesday, May 16, 2017, at University Hospital in Cleveland, Ohio. He was born in Chardon Village on June 29, 1927. He was a 1945 graduate of Chardon High School, and married Ellen Tucker in Hambden, on April 11, 1952. Harley had worked for the Nickle Plate Rail Road for 5 years before becoming a laborer for the former Chardon Rubber Company, where he retired after 33 1/3 years on July 11, 1990. He was a member of URW Local 557, and had also served as the Township Constable. as well as a member of the Hambden Fire Department. Harley was an NMRA Life Member and a founding member of Division 5 back in 1961. He played a very active role in the Division for many, many years. He had regular monthly operating sessions on his HO Ohio Northern Railroad for the past 50 years. He was the King of open loads, creating unique designs using parts from his junk box for all sorts of railcars. (These were affectionately referred to as "Harley Loads".) He was also the proprietor of

Smith & Son Ballast. Harley served as Division 5 Superintendent several different times. He was our Division Trip Master for many years, arranging for Division members to tour numerous railroad and industrial facilities. Harley was presented with the Mid Central Region's "2005 Russ Wenderfer Award" by Mike Brestel. Vice President of the NMRA and member of MCR Division 7. Division 7 sponsors the award and the region BOD chooses the recipient. The award is given to the MCR member that has exhibited extraordinary devotion to, and promotion of, the hobby of model railroading. In 2011, at the Division's 50th anniversary celebration, Harley was one of the Division members presented with the "Division 5 Lifetime Achievement Award". This award is for outstanding service to Division 5 and the hobby of model railroading. Harley (and Ellen) were always happy to open their home and railroad for events and Division meetings.


Survivors include his wife Ellen; daughter LuAnn (Dennis) Burger, son Dale (Deborah) Smith of Hambden Twp.;
