

Division 5 Meeting Minutes

March 2, 2018

The February 2, 2018 membership meeting was called to order at 7:30 PM by Superintendent Dave Neff at Hambden Township Hall. 29 members and 2 guests were present.

The members present had a moment of silence in memory of longtime member Dale Smith.

Division 5 is nominating Dale Smith posthumously for both a region and national award in recognition of Dale's many accomplishments within Division 5 and model railroading in general.

We are in need of people to come early to **the Division meetings** to help setup the room for our monthly meeting. You would need to be there by 6:45 pm. We are also in need of a backup person to haul the trash from the meeting home with them. Dennis Lloyd has volunteered to do this task when he is able to attend the meeting. We need someone who can fill in for Dennis when he isn't there.

We are ready for **Railfest 2018** in just two weeks! All tables have been sold. Jim Wendorf and Tom Pescha ran through the various times when members were needed at Lakeland Community College to help with setup, teardown, and the general running of the show.

The election of a Division superintendent is proving difficult this year. Dave Neff has filled the office for two terms and is required by the Division's and Region's Regulations to sit out a term before running again. The Nominating Committee was unable to find anyone willing to run for Superintendent. A lengthy discussion of the various options available to us were discussed. One option is to disband the Division. No one was in favor of that. Another option proposed was to have someone run for Superintendent and then resign after being elected, forcing the MCR President to have to appoint a superintendent for the Division. Dennis Lloyd volunteered to do this but he was on the Nominating Committee and they cannot nominate themselves. Dennis resigned from the Nominating Committee. Since Dale Smith was the other member of the Nominating Committee and he had recently passed away, the Division was left without a Nominating Committee. Wayne Lette and Paul Emch volunteered to form the new Nominating Committee. Dennis Lloyd was nominated to run for Superintendent. Also, since Dennis was to be the election Teller, a replacement Teller was needed. Don Thomas volunteered to take on this role. There was also discussion about changing the Division Regulations but it was noted that this takes some time plus we are bound by the Regulations of the Mid Central Region. It was also noted that no one in the Division is entirely clear on how the MCR's Regulations apply to our situation. We need to review the MCR Regulations and talk with the MCR President. (Clerk's Note: It was later determined after the meeting that the MCR President can appoint a division superintendent in the case where no one is willing to run for division superintendent. Thus, there is no need for us to have someone run with the intention of resigning shortly after being elected. Because of this, Dennis Lloyd has withdrawn his nomination.)

Upcoming meetings and programs: We currently do not have a program for the April meeting. The May meeting is planned to be a joint meeting with Division 12 in Cambridge Springs, PA with a slide program by Dick Bradley. The June meeting will be held at Lake Farmpark. We don't have a program for this meeting yet. The Bring & Brag theme will be Agriculture Related.

Upcoming events: Jefferson, Ohio train show on Saturday, July 21. The Division 5 picnic on Sunday, July 22 at the Painesville Depot. An August movie night at Bill Osborne's home, possibly in place of our August meeting. Model Train Days will be held at the Painesville Depot on May 5-6. The Painesville Depot will be celebrating the 125th anniversary of the depot building on August 4.




















Division 5 2018 Election Nominations



Working on the Railroad

A Great Tool and an Interesting View

The Camera Car

ne of the most interesting tools on my layout was a camera car. About six years ago I bought a camera for the layout and had it mounted in an F7 diesel engine dummy, cost about \$100. It gave me a grand view of the 225 feet of main line track while sitting in front of a monitor positioned above the

power station of the layout. But as time went on, the camera started failing and the picture on the monitor was constantly tearing and full of annoying static lines. In addition to that problem, every time the engine was maneuvering a curve, the camera was unable to see the track in front of itself. When I mentioned my dilemma to Al Arthur, he suggested a new

camera that would be mounted on its own set of trucks. Within 2 weeks, Al presented me with an old passenger car with a camera in front mounted on its own set of trucks directly under the camera, all for a ridiculously low price of \$20. The new camera car only had one coupler on the rear of the car because it was pushed by a powered engine giving you a view on the monitor as if you



were actually riding in the cab of the engine. The camera provided a beautiful picture without those irritating static lines. Everything ran great but the unit needed to be fine-tuned at Al's work place at his home. I loved everything about the car except for the fact that there was no coupler in front of the car. So I asked Al to install a coupler on the front of



the car and possibly raise the height of the camera so it would simulate riding in the cupola of a caboose when pulled at the end of a train. A week later the car was returned and pressed into service. With approximately 20 per cent of my main line traversing tunnels, subways and traveling behind mountains, the operator still gets a great view



from the cab of his engine without even seeing his train. This powerful tool has helped avoid multiple derailments, collisions, switches set in the wrong position and running off the mainline onto an unwanted siding, all with impressive views form the engine cab or the cupola of the caboose.
