



## **Division 5 BOD Meeting**

April 8, 2019

A **Division 5 BOD meeting** was held on April 8, 2019 at Hambden Town Hall. In attendance were Mike Buehner, Bryan Persing, Bonnie Lette, Wayne Lette, Matt Kross, Chuck Limbert, and Mike Carovac.

**Wayne Lette** has "retired" as a Division 5 Director. Mike Carovac has been selected as the new Division 5 Director. Thank you Wayne for your years of service on the BOD and we welcome Mike as the newest member on the BOD.

Reviewed how Railfest 2019 went. Railfest Chairman Jim Wendorf sent the BOD an e-mail summarizing the attendance and financial numbers. The show was successful and went fairly well. We will not be able to apply for the Lake County Visitor Bureau's grant next year and so we need to determine how we handle that hole in our advertising income. The new "Train Ride Ticket Survey" program needs some refinement – more/better communication to the public and the volunteers about how it operates. We should look at alternate ways of running the door prizes. Instead of soliciting door prizes from the vendors, it was suggested that we print a stack of special Railfest certificates to hand out that are good for a dollar amount at any dealer. We definitely need to get more and better carts for hauling dealer merchandise. If we can't store the carts, consider selling/raffling off/ giving away the carts once the show is over.

Reviewed the upcoming MCR convention in Boardman, Ohio and the MCR BOD meeting that will be held there. It was suggested that the topic of NMRA Family Memberships with their limitations be brought up at the MCR BOD. A number of Division 5 BOD members feel that the NMRA restriction that Family Members cannot hold office or serve on the BOD is ridiculous. The current NMRA rules require that a husband and wife both be Full Members in order to serve instead of one being a Full Member and the other a Family Member.

The **Division 5 picnic** will be on Saturday, July 13, 2019 at the Painesville Depot.

No Division 5 membership meeting in July.

We believe **Lake Farmpark** will be conducting their Boy Scout Railroading Merit Badge Workshop during Railroads In The Parks on June 1, 2019. We do not know at this time whether they need or want Division 5's help with this event? The Division has already supplied the HO boxcar kits for the program.

Nothing has been done yet with the **membership survey** that was going to be put together. Mike Buehner will work on and get something into the Trainwire.

It was suggested that we put together a Division guideline for putting on a clinic at our meetings.

We need to start adding the phrase "Subject to Change – check the Division 5 website for current details" to all future Division flyers. A number of things have changed lately on future events where we have already printed the flyers for the event.

Reviewed how we will adapt our "How To Build A Model Railroad" promo day at its new location, the Painesville Depot. There is concern that we will not have enough space and need to cut back on the number demonstration tables. We need to discuss this with the Painesville Depot coordinators.

## Model Kits vs. Ready to Run

s many of you know I collect and restore railroad equipment, signs, signals, whistle posts etc. and anything that brings a tear to my eye when I move it. As I get older I find it's getting harder and harder to lift. I'm currently in a race to finish the barn full of signals I have before I'm drooling in my oatmeal. I have put model railroading on the back burner for the past 10 to 15 years to work with this stuff. I still attended NMRA meetings because I enjoy the people in the group. I like being around people with the same interests especially the people of division 5. During the winter months I would do limited work on my signals but this winter I decided to get back to modelling. When I was in it heavy I was kind of in a buying frenzy and I realized that I have dozens and dozens of kits that I haven't built yet. So I have decided to start building them. The hobby has changed a bit since I have been out of it. The companies that made kits (Branchline, Proto 2000, Intermountain etc.) no longer make kits. Today's modeler doesn't want to build kits but wants ready to run open the box and put it on the track stuff. That's okay I get it as I have bought (RTR) stuff as well. As I look at the cost of the kits compared to the cost of assembled cars, I begin to wonder "What's my time worth?" Time is a commodity that we can't bank, store, purchase more or sell off excess, (who has excess time to sell off anyway?), so make the most of it. With kits I can assemble a fleet of rolling stock more economically than with RTR stuff as those cars are 30 to 40 dollars more. The feeling of satisfaction when a model is completed is **priceless**. So as I build these kits this winter I think todays modeler is missing out on all the fun like being on your hands and knees searching the carpet for the grab iron that disappeared from your tweezers on its way to the

car, or wrestling with glue that sets up before you can get the part in the hole **because** your hand is shaking a little. Or the magnifier that goes out of focus because you move your head a little. This is all very rewarding. So, "What's my time worth?" A lot because I'm model railroading and not at work. Just my thoughts.


