

New Membership Feature

Member Roster for NMRA MCR Division 5 Members ONLY

Are you needing to contact someone in the division and don't know how? Well now you can! The only people that can see your information are other current Division 5 members. However, if your membership has expired, you will no longer be able to sign in.

In a new section of the division website called "Members Info" we have everyone in our division listed. The list comes from the NMRA and is provided monthly to our Division Clerk in order to maintain our membership roster. To see this information, you must sign into the Member Login section of the division website www.mcr5.org. There in the lower right-hand side of the webpage you will find the link. This area of our website will allow you to edit your information that you would like to share with the other division 5 members. Only the information you enter will be shared.

While compiling the survey that different members filled out; people wanted to know how to get in touch with another member for various reasons. Because of the Privacy Laws, we are not able to publish a membership roster as we once did. So, this has been created for the use of the membership. You as a member have the control of what information you want to share with others. Remember to fill out the "Help/Advise" area if you are willing to help or advise when questions come up. Enjoy!!

How To Login

Click on the Member Login on the main page.



To sign in for the first time, you must use the following information as it appears on your NMRA membership card. Enter your First Name, Last Name, and Password (the first six (6) digits of your NMRA #) (if you are a Life Member please enter an "L" in front of the first (5) digits of your NMRA #). Click Login.

Division Announcement

The first time logging in, you MUST use the first and last name that is on your NMRA membership card. For example, if you go by your middle name Mike but the NMRA has you listed by your first name of Alan, you must enter Alan as your first name. Or, if the NMRA lists you as William but everyone calls you Bill, you must enter William for your first name. Once you have logged in, you can change your first name in the Division 5 system to what you want to be known as and this new first name will be used for your future logins on the Division 5 website.

Once you have logged in, you can also change your password to whatever you want it to be but it must meet the password requirements specified (one or more uppercase letters, one or more lowercase letters, one or more numbers, and be at least six characters long).

Once you log in, you will be into the Members Info section. Click on any of the buttons to turn that column On/Off: Addresses, Phones, Emails, Help/Advise, All or Print. The 3 buttons at the top allow you to: Change your Info, View Private Member Only Information (i.e. Layout Tours, any other items that we need to get out to the group), and Log Out.

Keep in mind that this section of the website is still in the development stages and screens may change.

The MOD Squad

I was the last person I would ever think of who would be writing an article on a module group; and even more so joining one. However, here I am a proud member of Northeast Ohio's newest module group "The MOD Squad". When I would attend a train show I would see all these people hauling in their pieces along with whatever they put on top of them. Then a few hours later I would see them break it all down again and carry it out to a trailer or a car. I always wondered why do all of that work to just run a few trains for a couple of hours. In my mind if I wanted to run trains I will go to my basement and run trains on my permanent layout. No setup time, no complicated wiring, no waiting for other people to arrive; it just seemed too complicated in my mind. Well I could not have been more wrong. Being part of a module group is actually quite fun and after our first initial set up, trying to figure how everything hooked up, is not that complicated.

Our group is aligned with Lionel and the Lionel Collectors Club of America module standards. They came out with their standards around 2013 when they heard from their membership a desire to have an O gauge module system; were theoretically a group in part of the country could set up with other groups in another area of the country. There has been some small interest for the past couple of years about forming a group in Ohio on the numerous online model railroad message boards; but it wasn't until this past summer when a group of gentleman from primarily Lake County took up the reigns and ran with it. In the short span of 6 months our group has grown to around 20 members and we currently have 16 straight modules and 8 curved modules. Each module is 45" long by 30" deep and will actually fit into the back seat of a normal sized car.

Next on our agenda was to determine what we wanted to do with our module setup. Should we pick a theme and everyone build to that or should we let everyone build to their own

vision. Since our primary focus is to promote the hobby and show outsiders that the main focus is to have fun we decided to go with everyone on their own. At the time of me writing this article we have had 2 real shows and 1 soft opening and at every show we have had lots of comments on how people enjoy seeing the different visions of each module owner. We have some guys doing transition era, some modern era, some cities, some country/ wooded, and even one gentleman showing how to incorporate Legos as the primary focus of a layout.

We are in the early stages of booking shows in the Northeast Ohio area, but as you can imagine with O gauge we need quite a bit of room so that is a problem that we will have to keep solving. In conclusion if you were like me and never thought about joining a modular group, keep an open mind because you never know what you may be missing.
