Recently I was asked a very thought provoking question by my 22 year old son. As the two of us were traveling down the road we started talking about our hobbies. My son, Joseph, has been an avid horseman since he was two years old and has recently purchased a new horse named Stella. As we talked about how he was going to train her he asked me this question, "Your hobby is model trains. What part of the hobby do you like?" This

caught me off guard as I had to stop and think about it. Do I like running the trains, doing the scenery, working the operations, or spending the time on detail work? After pondering for a few minutes my answer was the detail work. Although this did not surprise my son it did reflect something we both have in common, patience. As most of you know I am a company truck driver and on my trips I tend to look for anything train oriented I can use or put on my layout. for hoppers, flatcars, and gondolas to be very enjoyable. I have made prime movers loads, pipe loads, generator loads, transformer loads and wood loads for my flat cars. My hoppers have coal and ballast loads although I do need to make a lot more of these loads. The gondola loads seem to me to be the most challenging as they can have everything listed above plus coil steel, scrap steel, building rubble, both fresh lumber and scrap lumber like old railroad ties or tree stumps. Recently I was on 180 east leaving Youngstown. On this route you can see this very large metal recycling facility with a large amount of scrap steel roll offs and gondolas being loaded and unloaded. Because of an accident further up the road which turned I80 east into a parking lot, I was able to watch a shredder grind up scrap cars and steel items and dump the shredded material into gondolas which most likely were headed to the mills. All the way back to the shop I was trying to figure a way to replicate the shredded material. What I came up with was pencil shavings. Once glued and painted to a piece of foam fitted to a gondola it looks really good. If you shift the pencil shavings you get a finer version suitable for N scale.

I have come to enjoy letting my son and wife drive me around, I look out the side window for a reason, as I get to see a lot more of what is going on. Such a simple question he asked for something so detailed.

It for reasons like that listed above that the "Members Only" section was added to our web site. Each of us has a specialty that we can pass onto or help other members with. Please consider participating by signing into and listing your specialty.

If you are proud of your layouts or current projects send some photos to the Trainwire. We would love to see what you have got going on during this isolation period. ### **NOVEMBER MEETING**

### **Division 5 Membership Meeting Minutes**

November 6, 2020

The November 6, 2020 membership meeting was held virtually using Zoom. The meeting was called to order at 7:30 PM by Superintendent Matt Kross. 15 members and no guests were present.

Reviewed the status of various upcoming scheduled events:

There are no scheduled Division 5 events other than online meetings for the next several months As far as we know, train shows in Mansfield, OH on Nov 15 and Parma, OH on Nov 28 will still be held As of this meeting, the 2021 MCR Regional Convention in Erie, PA is still on

Still a possibility of a tri-region convention in 2022

2022 National NMRA Convention will be in St. Louis

The next Division 5 BOD meeting will be on Monday, February 8, 2021 at 7:30pm and will be held online using Zoom. There was a Mid Central Region virtual BOD meeting on Friday, October 23, 2020.

Since all the candidates for MCR offices were running unopposed, the MCR BOD elected the candidates by Acclamation. On very own Dave Neff will be our new Region President starting at the end of May 2021.

The various region divisions discussed how they are dealing with the restrictions caused by Covid-19. Many divisions are making great use of online meetings.

There are some intellectual property issues with many divisions recording meetings and posting to websites for public access. The Region is reviewing this and will attempt to issue some guidelines.

We need to look at ways to safely invite non-members to our online meetings. There are a number of security measures now in place to prevent anonymous people from joining the meeting intent on disrupting the meeting.

Region (and National NMRA) membership has been dropping during 2021.

18 of the N scale reefers are still available at the reduced pricing for Division 5 members. You have until November 9, 2020 to purchase one.

#### Modeling Question:

How do you get dry transfer lettering to stick? Tried roughing the surface but that didn't help. Some responses were: paint the surface with flat paint; put dry transfer lettering on clear decal paper, spray with dull coat, and then apply as a decal.

What is the best way to store decals? No responses.

Items for the good of the order:

Dave Neff talked about his efforts to implement N Scale Architect's M-Track system. He found that using 22AWG floral wire worked better than the phosphor bronze wire provided. He also found that using pressure sensitive adhesive from Micro Mark worked well in attaching the track.

The Trainwire Editor asked if there was any problem in accepting Trainwire submissions from non-Division members. The response was that it was fine for outside people to submit articles. It is up to the discretion of the Trainwire Editor whether to publish items submitted. Non-Division members are not eligible to receive Division Award Certificates for their submissions, however.

### **Steel Mill Fire Hydrants**

I saw the following picture in a steel mill book (Steel Mill Railroad Facilities and Equipment by Stephen M. Timko) and wanted to add this detail to my N-scale steel mill. Things are always bigger in a steel mill so I ordered some HO scale fire hydrants to use in my N scale mill. (Photo credit: Ray Hoadley)




I took some scrap .030" styrene sheet material and cut some rectangles of varying sizes to serve as a base. I cut some styrene rod to serve as the posts protecting the hydrant and glued these to the corners of the bases. I then glued the HO fire hydrants in the center. I made mine smaller than in the prototype picture due to my limited space. It still serves the purpose and conveys the general idea. I left the fire hydrants the color they came in. I may change them to yellow like in the prototype picture so that they stand out better. Since the HO fire hydrants I

ordered came in a pack of 8, I made 8 of these little assemblies and have them scattered around my steel mill buildings. - Matt Kross

### **Zoom Meeting Instructions**

### **Getting Started**

Up to 15 minutes before the meeting is scheduled to start, click on the link you were provided for the Zoom meeting or type it into your web browser.

If you have not used Zoom before on your computer, you will be instructed to download the Zoom application. You need to do this but it doesn't take very long.

Zoom will ask for or show your default name. Enter your name so we know who you are.

You have an opportunity to test your audio at this point by clicking on "Test Computer Audio." Once you are satisfied that your audio works, click on "Join audio by computer."

You will be placed in a waiting room until the meeting host allows you to join the meeting. This is why we need to know who you are.

#### Once You Are Connected

At the bottom of your screen you should see the following participant controls:



### Mute/Unmute your microphone

Start/Stop Video – turns your webcam on or off

View Participant list – opens a pop-out screen that includes a "Raise Hand" icon that you may use to raise a virtual hand. You can also change your screen name that is seen in the participant list and video window.

Chat allows you to type text messages to meeting participants

Somewhere on your Zoom screen you will also see a choice to toggle between "speaker" and "gallery" view. "Speaker view" shows the active speaker. "Gallery view" tiles all of the meeting participants.

#### **General Instructions**

If you want to be heard during the meeting, you need to make sure your microphone is Unmuted. Normally, you should leave your microphone muted so that background noises (dogs barking, TV, phone ringing) are not picked up. At times in the meeting, the host may mute all participants to eliminate background noise.

You do not have to turn on your webcam (Start Video). If you do, the other meeting participants will see you which is nice during the social time. But, you can leave it off and a blank box with just your name will be seen by the others.

Gallery View displays all the meeting participants on one screen. The box of the person talking will be highlighted in yellow. Speaker View shows a full screen view of the current person speaking.

### **During The Meeting**

Mute your microphone unless you have something to say

Do not share your screen unless instructed to by the host

Unruly or unwelcome participants can be kicked out of the meeting by the host

Ask questions using the Chat box. The presenter will periodically check these.

Be aware that the meeting may be recorded.

Alternatively, you can go to the Members Only section of the Division 5 website to obtain the meeting link.
