#### **Assistant Super Comments**

I am sorry I did not attend the December members meeting but some family issues arose that needed my attention. I have been doing my little experiment with the 20 minute idea that Matt brought up a couple of months ago. Now, I have been avoiding layout tasks just because my set up time always seems to be more than 20 minutes, so I have concentrated on the detail work such as loads. What I have found

out is that it all depends on what you want to make, create, or how far along you want to get. For example, when making hopper loads such as coal or gravel it was easy to keep within the 20 minute guidelines, first cutting out the foam then forming the foam then adding the coal or gravel. #### **DECEMBER MEETING**

#### **Don't Throw Away Those Desiccant Packs**

I try not to throw anything away until I think about whether I could use if for something on the layout. In various medicine bottles I have opened over the years I have often found desiccant packs that are used to absorb moisture so that the medication doesn't. Most of the modern packs are small tubular plastic containers in three different sizes. Some medicines use a paper packet containing the desiccant. These also come in several sizes.



I was thinking I could paint these and somehow use them as some type of industrial product. However, the other day I looked more closely at these and found that I could pop the cap-type end off of these. Inside, you find a bunch of tiny little pellets that are the material that absorbs moisture. I can't see a way of using these little pellets and, since I don't know what they are made of and whether they are toxic, I throw these away. I do remove the paper label that is wrapped around some of the containers.









To remove the end cap, I stuck the dull side of an Exacto knife into the cap seam and pried the cap off. This tends to leave a mark on both sides of the seam since the plastic is very soft. You can work to dress up this mark or orient the final product so that the damaged side is towards the back and unseen.






What I am left with is the larger tube and the small end cap. Both of these have tiny perforations on the ends. They also have ribs inside that sort of look like fan blades.

What can you use these for? Well, they have an industrial look. I figure you can use them in any industrial scene as some sort of machinery, strainer, mixer, ventilator, etc. I took several of the emptied containers and painted them silver. I just set them on top of one of my buildings to see what they look like.

If you put these on something in the background you could probably use these to represent some sort of rooftop ventilators or air filtration system.







As far as the desiccants in paper packets, I took one of the ones I had and painted it white. While this is too large for N-scale, you could potentially use these as sacks of material for O or G scale. You can paint the packets whatever color needed to represent the desired product.

## Articles

#### The Story

This is a special work car for a branch line of the Burlington Northern in the Colorado Rockies. While there was a "Big Hook" for rescuing locomotives that have derailed, the Maintenance of Way crew needed something to assist them in their daily work. This car was a repurposed stock car. When asked why we didn't use a boxcar, the answer was simple. The stock car would have been scrapped. And, yes, a boxcar would be a better option but now we have something useful. If there is any spare time, the maintenance crew said they would line the inside with plywood.

#### The Model

This model was intended to be part of a work train on my layout. This N-scale crane car started off as Life-Like's Union Pacific stock car. I cut away the roof, doors and sides, then imagined what might be needed for daily operations.

The original color of the stock car was a bright yellow. I brush painted the car with Polly Scale Special Oxide Red. The trucks were dry brush weathered also with the Special Oxide Red. The decking was painted Polly Scale 'something' Grey. (The lettering on the jar wore off.) Most of the weathering was diluted Polly Scale Engine Black.

The base for the crane was originally from the display stand for a ship model. The crane originally was part of an 1/540 scale aircraft carrier. I added a hoist and motor to the frame of crane. When I was painting the hoist and motor, a small fleck of black paint touched the hook. I was about to wipe it off when I saw that it looks like a safety latch. I guess some mistakes are meant to be.

The barrels are pewter. Two of the boxes at the end of the car are balsa wood and the other two 'lockers' are chunks of styrene plastic. The figures are Woodland Scenic 'dock workers'.
