Aren't you working on anything that you can tell us about? You don't have to build something. You can tell us about a new way you found to operate your railroad or tell us about a good railroad book you found. Your Assistant Superintendent, Mike Carovac, has really been trying hard to do at least some model railroading every day. Hopefully you are reading his column in the Trainwire and following his efforts. Perhaps he will inspire you to try his approach of 20 minutes a day of model railroading.

Desperate For Meeting Programs

It is a real challenge to try and come up with something for our meetings to keep you folks informed and entertained. During Bring 'n' Brag, we are finding that a number of people are doing interesting things. We have been able to stretch a number of these Bring 'n' Brag presentations out into longer segments such that they become mini clinics. Steel Mill Research and Ghost Rails Books

I hadn't been doing much with the steel mill on my layout and wanted to start getting into the details of stuff around the mill. I hadn't done any web searches for a while so I did some in early January. One of the online steel mill modeling publications is "The Mill" which can be found at https://

forgotten that it was available. I came across it again and downloaded all the issues I had missed. One thing that they have at the end of every issue is a list of steel mill reference material. One of the things listed in the references is the Ghost Rails series of books. These are sort of history books containing lots of pictures about railroads and industries that used to exist in western Pennsylvania and eastern Ohio. Several of them cover the Beaver Falls, PA area where I grew up and I have several of these on order. Part of what these books cover are the steel mills in the area and include those in the Youngstown and Warren Ohio area as well as Beaver Falls, Sharon, and Pittsburgh Pennsylvania area. Ghost Rails Volume 17 was released in August 2020. It covers USS Ohio Works and the Y&N RR. SPECIAL NOTE: Ghost Rails Volume 19 is due out in Spring/Summer 2021 and is going to cover the B&O Lake Branch. **SIDE NOTE:** As I was corresponding via email with the author of the Ghost Rails books, it turns out he was a young English teacher in my high school back when I graduated in 1974. I never had him for a course but I do remember him. Small world.

My Past Month Modeling Work

Most of what I have been working on during the

past month was purchasing and building various detail parts for my layout. One of the things, which I shared at the January meeting, are some electrical transmission towers for my steel mill. I found a prototype picture of some towers that I liked and have been trying to find a way to model them. This is still a work in progress. I got a few ideas from suggestions that were made during and after the January meeting. I recently purchased a Micro-Trains CSX MOW tie loader car set. Most Micro-Trains items come ready-to-run, but this set required assembly of the gondola extended sides and the tie crane. I found the instructions and the plastic castings to be rather poor. I expected better from MicroTrains. A couple of other things that I shared at the January meeting was the work I was doing on improving my layout room lights and my construction of an odometer car to measure the distance of my mainline. These both are still worksin-progress.

I hope the new year has started out well for you. Please join us for our February online meeting. See you down the line.



Building a T-Trak Logging Module

The idea of making a T-Trak diorama was intriguing, so I thought about buying a single module. At the September 2019 Mini-Meet in Erie, PA, I was fortunate enough to be given by CMR Products a double T-Trak module, which had a tunnel that didn't meet clearance specs. After adding shims to increase the

height of the tunnel, I decided to cut off six inches of length to allow for better visibility of the scenery. At the October 2019 Berea Show I looked for a building kit suitable for mountainous terrain and found the Valley Sawmill, which became the focal point of this logging module, and sketched a layout plan. The sawmill kit base was too large, so it had to be cut and rearranged to fit in the space allocated. I later eliminated one maintenance shed and replaced it with two outhouses. I wanted to show evidence of logging in the wooded mountains and also included a log pond. I added a dirt road, log trucks and a freight station to indicate activity in and out of the area.




I started out by first cutting all components in the structure kit off the sprues and painting them with acrylic craft paints before building the sawmill, maintenance sheds, wagon, turbine, saw and crane. Next, the two main base sections were glued together, the ties were painted, and the rails were glued on. The adhesives used were Aleene's Tacky Quick Dry and Fast Grab Glues. Then I assembled the two log carts and added logs, which are twigs from trees in our woods. (They replaced the plastic logs included in the kit.) Coarse dirt, a little ballast, sawdust, and used tea bag leaves were used for ground cover. I assembled the turbine and saw and glued them in place, adding a rubber band to look like a drive belt. (See Figs. 2, 3, 4.) The crane needed cable and a hook, which were not in the kit, but gray thread and a piece of hook-shaped scrap plastic were added. Workers and carts were glued in place before the roof supports, wiring and the roof were added. Weathering of the roofs completed the model.









Next, the entire module (Fig. 5) was painted brown, then pink and blue foam was glued to the base and carved to form the mountain, and covered with a coat of neutral gray paint. Earth-tone paints were stippled on, ground foam and small bushes were glued on, and gloss medium was used for water run-off. The N-scale double track was nailed in place and ballasted, and wiring was added (Figs. 6, 7). Most of the

trees are made of pieces of green

polyfiber sprayed with hairspray, dipped in super leaves and ground foam, and then glued to tree trunks cut from twigs. The tree trunks were first glued into the ground cover (Fig. 8). Along the edges of the wooded areas I used tree armatures for a more realistic appearance. The area with tree stumps and debris represent the logging operation.



The log pond was painted navy blue, which was then washed with mud tones and olive green. Then, three coats of Mod Podge gloss medium were applied. While the final coat of gloss medium was still wet, I placed twigs cut in half lengthwise flat side down to look like logs floating in the water. Some white paint was dry-brushed on ripples and along the edges of the logs.





The freight station kit was assembled with moveable sliding doors and lots of detail parts and workers. Log loads on the trucks were glued on to resemble actual log trucks shown in internet images. (See Figs. 9, 10). Scenery materials used all over the module included ground foam in several colors, static grass





material, clump foliage, lichen, coarse dirt, tea bags, sawdust, pencil shavings, and talus. The tunnel is intended to be removable, if necessary, to accommodate trains pulling extra-

high loads or to clear a derailment inside. The same techniques were used to complete the rock wall and the trees as the mountain. The tunnel portals are paper glued to thin basswood coated with matte medium. If you look closely you'll see a logger checking out a stand of trees. (See Figs. 11, 12.)



The backdrop is foam board painted light blue and the scenery is a collage of photos taken on vacation in 2019 in West Virginia. When I'm satisfied with the final appearance, I plan to scan the pieces and print them in two sections to glue onto the backdrop board. Finally, I have to add more weeds, debris, barrels, a ladder, etc., especially around the shed. I would also like to add LED lighting to the sawmill, because the light included in the kit is obsolete.
