


NICKEL PLATE

The day starts out at the coal tower for this 0 8 0. Today it will be assisting a Fairbanks Morse Switcher in the yard while it's coaling up a Berkshire; that takes on coal for its job to haul fast freight across the system. An SW8 shoves hoppers into the dumper to replenish the tower. Almost full of coal, it will back up to the water plug. After its morning service it's off to the yard. Today it will be spotting cars at the Lawsten Foundry Company. Later in the day she is moving loaded gondolas full of wire to be spotted for an east-bound train leaving tonight. Meanwhile the FM is moving tons of scrap where they will be unloaded by an electromagnetic crane and sent to the furnace to be melted down. At the end of the day the fire is dropped and put away till Monday morning and the sequence starts all over again. Man I would like to go back to 1957 to witness this in person.

NMRA

Several new books are now available covering railroading in our local area.

I was informed by the author of a new book that includes the history of the B&O Lake Branch that he now has copies in-hand. This is Volume 19 in the Ghost Rails series of books. I ordered my copy last week. See the attached information.

Also, there is another new book covering the B&O Lake Branch written by Dan Rager. This book is available at the Painesville Railroad Museum and a few local stores or you can order online. I bought a copy for myself from the Museum during our Division 5 picnic there last weekend.

Dan Rager, a member of the Cleveland & Eastern Interurban Historic Society, has published a new book about the railroad that once ran through Chardon and Middlefield.

The book, Building the Lake Branch, Complete History, 1835-2021, Vol.4, is a comprehensive history of the line that eventually became the Lake Branch of the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad (Chessie System), and ran from Fairport Harbor through Painesville to Youngstown, Ohio.

The publication explains the complex development of railroads in the region. It describes how the Lake Branch, which had a dozen different names over its 185-year history, evolved from a narrow-gauge passenger and freight railroad into a major standard-gauge mover of iron ore to the steel mills of Youngstown and Pittsburgh and hauler of coal to the port at Fairport Harbor on Lake Erie.

The Cleveland & Eastern had connections with the B & O in Chardon and Middlefield. This allowed the C & E to transfer materials and equipment during its construction. The Chardon connection also allowed the early C & E steam engines to access the B & O's water tank and was later used to transfer coal to its power plant and residents of Gates Mills.

The book contains 300 color and black & white photos, maps, blueprints, and 'then and now' photos. It describes the lives of those who lived and worked on the road, as well as the events that took place. It has separate chapters detailing the history of each village through which the line passed, including current photos showing remnants of the line. In addition, it contains a unique listing of 546 Ohio railroads and 930 Lake Erie vessels.




Lake Park—Fort Myers, Florida

In 2020 my wife and I purchased a vacation home in Fort Myers, Florida. The first year we spent all of our time just trying to renovate the property and furnish it. This year when we went down for the month of July we actually wanted to explore the area and try to discover some hidden gems. One that we found that would be of interest to fellow railroad enthusiast is called Lake Park. Even better for us is that this huge park is directly behind the community our house is located.

The first time we visited we went for what we thought was going to be a farmers market; however we discovered those are not held in the summer months. Instead of being disappointed and leaving we had heard a rumor that there was some activities of interest for railroad fans. What we discovered tucked into one corner of the park was worth the effort to find. Some of the highlights of this area include a depot styled museum containing a working model railroad, a train simulator, a small theatre, donated modules, library, and other various railroad artifacts. We spent time in the museum exploring the various items of interest; it also helped that the museum is air conditioned which might of contributed to our rather long stay inside on this day as the temperature approached triple digits. Once done exploring it was our time to ride the 1/8 scale railroad through the park. This train ride takes approximately 15 minutes to complete the loop throughout this corner of the park. It goes through various scenes depicting historical southwest Florida. We actually paid to go on the ride twice because we wanted to see their scenes as well as the actual park. Finally as you exit the train ride they have an actual steam engine and tender that you can visit.
