

- Take down displays and signs





AIRTHCHES

The Cedar Point & Lake Erie Railroad

We recently toured the Cedar Point & Lake Erie car shop and maintenance area as part of the Mini-Bunch narrow gauge fall meet. Our very knowledgeable tour guide, Jon Manasco, has worked for the rail-road for over 20 years.

The C.P. & L.E. RR will celebrate its 60th anniversary in 2023. It opened in the summer of 1963 and is one of the oldest rides in the park. It had 116 million riders in the first 50 years of operation, and they are hoping to reach 130,000 passengers this year following shortened seasons due to the pandemic. It is a threefoot narrow gauge railroad with over 2 miles of track and two stations, the main station in Celebration Plaza and a second station in Frontiertown at the far end of the park, where retired engine Albert is currently on display. The 15-minute ride on open air coaches, which are built on the trucks of old D&RGW narrow gauge stock cars, passes over several bridge trestles and runs through Boneville. The western-themed town entertains passengers with 52 mostly animatronic skeletons performing the usual wild west scenarios.

Cedar Point owns five steam locomotives fueled by coal, four in operating condition, and one gasoline-powered engine. Two engines, Albert and Maud L, were originally in service in 1963. The Albert, type 2-6-0, was built in 1910 by the Davenport Locomotive Works in Davenport, IA, to transport sugarcane from a plantation in Louisiana. Before it was sold to Cedar Point, it served as a passenger locomotive for a scenic railroad in Cherokee, NC. The Maud L, a 1902 Baldwin, was traded in 1999 to Walt Disney World and now operates at Disneyland. The Judy K and the Myron H are the primary locomotives used daily, and the George R and the G.A. Boeckling are backups if needed.

The Myron H and the Judy K were originally 0-4-0T type engines but were converted to 2-4-0 with ten-

ders by C.P &L.E. Both were built by the Vulcan Iron Works in Wilkes-Barre, PA, Myron H in 1922 and Judy K in 1923, and are almost identical. Myron H was originally owned by a coal company in Ohio for use in coal mining, but was sold six times before being bought by Cedar Point. Judy K was first owned by a company in Lansing, MI, and its original use is unknown, but it was sold to a stone company in Illinois. After one more change of ownership, it was bought by Cedar Point.

The George R, type 0-4-0T, was built in 1942 by the H.K. Porter Co. in Pittsburgh, PA. Its original use was limestone mining in Pennsylvania. It was first sold in 1962 to the American Railroad Equipment Assn., and then leased in 1963 to Cherokee Wonderland in North Carolina before it was sold to Cedar Point in 1968. This engine was unusual because it was built to 3 feet 2 inches. Cedar Point had to narrow it by 2 inches and convert it to a 2-4-0. George R is no longer certified to carry passengers due to the riveted boiler not passing inspection, but it can be used in the yard.

The G.A. Boeckling, type 0-4-0T, was built in 1927 by the Davenport Locomotive Works in Davenport, IA for use in coal mining in Pennsylvania. After two ownership changes, the engine was converted into a 2-4-4RT, then sold and adapted for use at a Six Flags Park in Illinois. It was sold one more time before it was traded to Disneyland, then tested at Disney World and put on display at Epcot. In 1999 Disney traded it to Cedar Point for the Maud L. In 2007 it was relocated to Knott's Berry Farm in CA. It returned to Cedar Point in 2010 and was converted to a 2-4-0 in 2011.

The Little Engine was built sometime in the late 1960's or early 1970's by the Plymouth Locomotive Works in Plymouth, OH. It was custom designed to look like a small mining steam engine, but has a gasoline engine. It is used for moving locomotives and coaches around the rail yard and in the shop, as well as for track work and other maintenance. This tour was an interesting behind-the-scenes look at the area not open to the public.
