#### **Division 5 Membership Meeting Minutes**

May 5, 2023

The May 5, 2023, membership meeting was held at Hambden Township Hall. The meeting was called to order at 7:30 PM by Superintendent Matt Kross. 18 members and 1 guest were present.

Reviewed upcoming Division 5 meetings and events.

June Div 5 membership meeting pushed back a week to Friday, June 9.

We will have our annual outdoor train movie night at Bill Osborne's home but, unlike in the past, it will not be in place of our regular monthly meeting. It will probably be held on a weekend in July but Bill still needs to determine what date will work the best for him. Stay tuned for details.

We will have our annual Division 5 family picnic on Saturday, August 5, at the Painesville Depot from 10am to 3pm.

Local events reviewed. Painesville Depot's Model Train Day on May 20 and Boy Scout Day on June 3. They will hold a workshop for the Boy Scout Railroading merit badge during that event. If any Division 5 member would like to assist with this workshop, contact the Painesville Depot. The Depot is also hosting a program on the history of the Cleveland, Painesville & Eastern interurban on June 4. They will also have a fleamarket on June 24 and their Hobo Day on July 29.

MER regional convention in Altoona will be held on Oct 19-22.

NMRA national convention is in the Dallas/Fort Worth area August 20 - 26.

Have gotten several new members in the past few months. Our Division membership is now up to 63 members.

#### **Division 5 Participation Incentives**

This is just a reminder about some of the incentives that Division 5 offers to the members for their participation in various Division activities.

#### **Bring & Brag**

Members who bring an item to display at the monthly meeting's Bring & Brag receive a \$5 award certificate. Bring & Brag items must have been completed within the last six months. The member must have put some reasonable amount of modeling effort into the construction or finishing of the item.

#### Building a model railroad display for public viewing

The Division will award a \$50 certificate to a member who builds a model railroad display and shows it at an NMRA event open to the public. Division funded displays are not eligible for this. The display must be at least 4 square feet in area.

#### Articles, tips, or pictures for Trainwire

Members that provide items for the newsletter will receive a \$10 award certificate for a one page or longer article, \$5 award certificate for a modeling tip or collection of pictures (5 pictures minimum) covering a relevant railroading activity. The Trainwire editor has final decision over whether the material is used or not. For items to be eligible for an award certificate, the member must have played an active part in generating the information. Thus, submitting an article cut out of the newspaper or a magazine does not qualify.

#### Clinic or presentation

Members that put on some type of clinic or presentation at a meeting or Division 5 event will receive a \$10 award certificate. The presentation must be at least 20 minutes in length.

#### **Discussion About Changing Meeting Day/Time**

At the May membership meeting, we had a discussion about changing our monthly membership meeting day and time. We went over the results of the membership survey on that topic.

#### **Survey Results**

#1 There have been informal discussions over the last few months about changing the day and time of the our monthly membership meeting. There are members that can't, or do not like to, drive at night and would like to have meetings during daylight hours. This is only a survey to determine the general membership feeling towards this topic. A formal vote will be needed once a final proposal is developed. Are you willing to consider changing the MCR Division 5 monthly meeting day/time?

35 out of 55 members responded to the survey. A large majority indicated that they are open to considering changing the day/time of the meeting. 34% indicated their preference was to keep the meeting on Friday evenings while 54% indicated they would prefer a day other than Friday. Of the options other than Friday nights, Saturday mornings was preferred the highest.

**Superintendent's Note:** During the May meeting discussion, there were some incorrect interpretations of the survey results made by members. They said that the survey shows the majority of people want to keep the meeting on Friday evenings which is not true. What the survey showed was that 12 people preferred keeping the meeting on Friday evenings while 19 people preferred having the meeting on a day/time other than Friday evenings. Yes, of the various day/time options presented, Friday was the most preferred, but this was just one option out of 4 possible. There was not a majority of the 35 survey participants that preferred Friday evenings. If members are presented with just one day/time alternative to the existing Friday evening meeting time, do they really want to change or leave things as is? That is why it has been suggested that we do a second survey with just the Friday evening and Saturday morning options.

#### **Issues With Changing Day/Time**

**Meeting Location** 

Hambden Town Hall may not always be available on Saturday mornings

Libraries are open on Saturdays so would be a possible location

May be difficult to get a constant location for the meetings

Interference with local train shows

Many members like to attend train shows on Saturdays

Some people say they can't / won't attend if we change from Friday evenings

Work issues, other things they do on Saturdays

Don't want meeting attendance to decrease

Our overall intent is to increase attendance/participation

#### **Alternatives**

Provide rides to the meetings for those that have difficulty driving

Haven't had any success with this so far

Small division / limited resources

Set up a "hybrid" meeting where we have in-person meetings but also broadcast the meeting via Zoom so those that cannot physically attend can participate in the meeting online

Some of those that have driving issues do not use a computer

When we held Zoom-only membership meetings, we did not get any different people join the Zoom meeting.

Running a hybrid meeting requires a couple of people to do this during a meeting and we have limited people resources.

Have some meetings on Friday nights and some on Saturday mornings Confusing?

#### Where Do We Go From Here?

The Division 5 Board of Directors will review the comments from the May meeting as well as the survey results and decide what to do next, if anything.

We will probably do a second survey with just the two most popular choices (Friday evenings vs. Saturday mornings)

Board of Directors will review the second survey results and any member comments to judge the overall feeling of the membership


If enough members desire a change, we will put it to an official vote of the membership

#### A Trip to Northlandz in Flemington, NJ

On a recent driving trip to New York City, I had the opportunity to stop at Northlandz ("The World's Largest Miniature Wonderland") in Flemington, NJ. Northlandz is basically halfway between New York City and Philadelphia.

Adult tickets are \$36, with discount admission of \$33 for kids, seniors, teachers, and military. Though not listed on the website, the same discount applies for first responders. Lastly, there is a separate ticket for the Outdoor Train Ride for \$16.

The main display at Northlandz is in HO scale and is sprawling and multiple floors high. I didn't personally count them all, but I can believe the stats listed on the website...

52,000 Square Feet Layout 250,000 Trees 400 + Bridges 200+ Tunnels

100+ Trains 35 Foot Canyons 8 Miles of Track

The website also claims 306,600 hours were spent on the construction of the layout it appears work continues. As we all know, model railroading is never "done"!

Even though the main attraction is the train layout, the display route also includes several side displays of vintage toys, dolls, artwork, and other mini train displays of various scales.

2000 Pipe Organs 250+ Art Pieces 200+ Dolls

The route for the train layout takes you around and sometimes through the middle of the display. You also experience the display from various levels to provide unique perspectives. At one point, you find yourself looking down at what feels like a 3-story valley. The tiny HO scale trains at the bottom of the huge valley look smaller than Z scale but you later confirm it is actually HO when you get down to lower level to see the same section from a different vantage point.


Probably my favorite part of the layout was the many bridges of various shapes, sizes, and lengths with some of them being quite large and impressive! There were a few that were the length and height are several feet with one stretching more than 20 in length!


I was there on a Friday around 3pm and I basically had the place to myself to explore! It took about 2 hours to go through the display, but the visit could easily take 3+ hours to see the many details and angles.

In the gift shop, there is a large assortment of railfan items and toys. They even have a section dedicated as somewhat of a flea market full of new and preowned model train items in various scales for sale.

If you ever find yourself near New York City or Philadelphia, I highly recommend you carve out time to make this part of your visit. You won't be disappointed and you'll most likely leave with new ideas and inspiration for your own layout!
