

Division 5 Membership Meeting Minutes

Next year's Mid Central Region convention will be in Cleveland area. Jerry Kruger, the convention chairman, will give us a presentation on the convention at our November meeting.

We currently need a meeting program for the December meeting.

It looks like we will have our annual Holiday Party in January. This will be discussed at this month's Division 5 BOD meeting.

Next year's Division 5 budget will be discussed at the upcoming Division 5 BOD meeting. If you would like to request money be allocated for a particular activity, please let a BOD member know.

Reviewed some of the highlights of the Mid Central Region BOD meeting.

The NMRA has released new, improved quality HO and N standards gages.

MCR 2025 convention will be held in Dublin, Ohio.

Division 5 elections will be held this coming Spring. Members are asked to start considering how they will help support the Division. We need people to run for Superintendent and Assistant Superintendent as well as serve on the Nominating Committee.

The Division Tripmaster proposed a road trip on Saturday, November 11, 2023 to see both the Sebring and Youngstown model railroad club layouts. This will be the only weekend when both clubs are having open houses on the same days. More details will be in the November Trainwire and at the November 3rd meeting. Initial plan is to carpool and leave around 9am. First stop will be the Sebring club, then Rob's Trains in Alliance, then stop for lunch at the Burger Hut in Alliance, then on to the Youngstown club. The group should get back around 6pm.

BOD Meeting 9 October 2023

A Division 5 BOD meeting was held on October 9, 2023. The meeting was held online using Zoom. In attendance were Matt Kross, Bonnie Lette, Wayne Lette, Bryan Persing, Andy Yedlick, and Chuck Limbert.

No new members this past month. Division 5 membership currently stands at 60. We currently have 12 Life members on our roster.

Promo Day 2023 planning status reviewed. Will meet with library director to finalize room layout and where people will be located. Raffle prizes consist of an N-scale train set, a number of different How-To books, and five RailPass memberships. Still need to work out the mechanics of how to conduct the raffle. There will be three separate categories for people to make raffle entries: Trainset, How-To Books, and RailPass Memberships. We have a lot of free magazines to put out for people to take. We have had one presenter cancel due to health issues. His presentation was to be on DCC. We got one new presenter that will do a demo on basic weathering. We will also have some railroad videos playing (without sound).

Railfest 2023 and Division 5 financial books have been audited through the end of August 2023. The auditors have submitted their reports for each of the two audits. No problems were found and all accounts balance. The auditors commended Jim Wendorf and Bonnie Lette for their excellent recordkeeping. We have sufficient funds to keep the Division running through the end of 2024 at a minimum. It was noted that over the last three years, the audits have all been conducted in the month of September. We should revise our By Laws to allow the audits to be conducted during this timeframe.

Railfest Chairman Jim Wendorf has told us that Railfest 2024 will be his last year as chairman. It is imperative that we have some people work with Jim this year to learn the process of running the show. Invitations to vendors and exhibitors will be sent out in November so we need someone very soon. We need to work with Jim to document all the tasks involved with putting on our Railfest.

- We will be having our annual Division 5 Holiday Party in January 2024. Tentative date will be Saturday January 6, 2024 at Hambden Town Hall. - We have had a number of RailPass members join our Division over the years but essentially none of them continue on to become a full NMRA member. Very few, if any, have come to our meetings. We send them a new member packet and invite them to our meetings. They receive our newsletter. Is there something else that we can do to encourage them to participate? Are there social media things we can do? Would some videos on YouTube help? Looking for ideas. One comment was that having interesting meeting programs draws people in. Recording some of our meeting highlights and posting them on FaceBook or YouTube might be helpful. We need to make sure we welcome new members in the Trainwire.
- Nominating Committee should be formed at the November Division 5 membership meeting. We will need an election Teller to tally votes if it is necessary to send out ballots.
- We will tentatively keep the 2024 Division 5 budget the same as the 2023 budget. The Treasurer will send a copy of the 2023 budget to the BOD to review. Final approval of the 2024 budget will be done at the November BOD.
- There are several Division documents that still need to be updated. The Membership Guide is the main one but there are also a few things in the By Laws that should be revised.
- The next Div 5 BOD meeting will be on Monday, November 13, 2023 at 7:30pm online using Zoom.

Nominating Committee Volunteers Needed

2024 will be an election year for Division 5 so we need to form a Nominating Committee before the end of 2023 to put together a slate of candidates. Division 5 2024 Elections

This coming spring will be election time again for Division 5. There are 2 elected officers in the Division:

- Superintendent
- Assistant Superintendent

Elections are held every two years in the Spring of the even-numbered years. Only Division 5 members may hold office. Terms are two years in length and are limited to 4 consecutive years (two terms) in a row in the same office. If a member has been in a position for two consecutive terms, they can be elected for that position again after they have been out of that position for one term.

If you are interested in running for Superintendent or Assistant, please contact a member of the Division 5 Nominating Committee or the Superintendent.

Division 5 Elected Officer Duties

The duties of the **Superintendent** are:

Preside at all Division 5, Board of Directors, and Executive Committee meetings.

Serve or appoint a proxy as the Division representative on the Region Board of Directors.

Assign the Assistant Superintendent suitable duties and keep him/her informed of Division 5 business.

Appoint chairpersons of committees required to accomplish the stated purposes of the Division.

Cooperate with other Divisions in every way possible.

The duties of the Assistant Superintendent are:

Assist the Superintendent in any way possible.

Assume the functions of the office of Superintendent during the absence of the Superintendent.

Arrange for programs (clinics, presentations, videos, etc.) at the monthly meetings.

Run the Bring 'n' Brag at the meeting.

Assist with the Raffle sales at the meeting.

Division 5 Election Process

The following are excerpts from our Division 5 Regulations explaining the election process:

The Division Nominating Committee shall be appointed by the Superintendent. It shall be composed of a Chairperson and two other members. Each person on the committee shall be from a different county of the Division. The current Superintendent shall not serve on the committee, nor sit with it during its deliberations. The Nominating Committee will report the nominations to the Clerk and the membership.

Members of the Nominating Committee may not nominate themselves for any office, including reelection for office.

The Teller shall report the results of the election to the officers of the Division and to all nominees prior to the May meeting. The results are to be announced by the Teller at the May meeting. Those elected shall be invited to participate in the May Board of Directors meeting. The newly elected officers will assume office June 1st.

Nominations for Division 5 offices may be made by a petition signed by two members and the nominee and submitted to the Nominating Committee. The signatures must be legible and the member's NMRA membership number and their membership expiration date must appear with the signature. The petition shall state for what office the candidate is seeking nomination. No candidate can be nominated for more than one office in an election.

Nominations from the Nominating Committee shall be presented at the January meeting of the election year. Nominations of members from the floor shall be presented at the February meeting of the election year. Nominations from the floor shall be by a motion and must be seconded. Nominees cannot nominate themselves.

No member shall be nominated to an elective office without their approval.

Election for Division officers shall be conducted by mail ballot. Nominees for office and qualifications for same shall be included in the March issue of the <u>Trainwire</u> for elected office balloting.

If all elected offices only have a single candidate, then an Election by Acclimation process can be implemented as long as the Division nominating committee has made a diligent effort/search for multiple candidates for each elected office. The Election by Acclimation process shall consist of the Division 5 Board Of Directors reviewing the actions of the Nominating Committee, and after determining that no suitable additional candidates can be found, passes by majority vote that the election process is complete and the specified candidates will be the new duly elected officers. No membership balloting (paper or otherwise) will be required for this process.

Terry has modeled a section of the UP from Cheyenne, Wyoming, to Hermosa Tunnel, 38 miles of the UP mainline from milepost 508 to 546. Wyoming scenery is well represented with specific UP locations modeled such as Tower A at the west end of Cheyenne Yard, Dale Junction, and Hermosa Tunnel. Layout has 1500 feet of track with massive staging yards. Mainline lap is 513 feet. Numerous scratchbuilt, kitbashed, and super-detailed structures and locomotives. 100% Trackwork, 90% scenery. Layout was featured in the January 2014 NMRA Magazine. Different sets of equipment are used to represent 4 time periods from the mid-50's to the present. The layout uses DC control.

Wireless walk-around DC throttles with homemade advanced DC control system. Some scratchbuilt turnouts with movable frog points. Railroad has a 400ft mainline run, 9 track holding yard, and two helixes. Logging operation containing an 8.5% grade with a switchback, shays, heislers, and a climax. Major scenery work since last year with the layout now about 60% scenicked.

Building a model railroad display for public viewing


The Division will award a \$50 certificate to a member who builds a model railroad display and shows it at an NMRA event open to the public. Division funded displays are not eligible for this. The display must be at least 4 square feet in area.

Articles, tips, or pictures for Trainwire

Members that provide items for the newsletter will receive a \$10 award certificate for a one page or longer article, \$5 award certificate for a modeling tip or collection of pictures (5 pictures minimum) covering a relevant railroading activity. The Trainwire editor has final decision over whether the material is used or not. For items to be eligible for an award certificate, the member must have played an active part in generating the information. Thus, submitting an article cut out of the newspaper or a magazine does not qualify.







How to Build a Model Railroad

AIRTHCILIES

My project was based on the Steelyard Heritage Center located at Cleveland's Steelyard Commons retail development. The museum and outdoor displays and art panels have served as a resting place for bicyclists, walkers and joggers who use the towpath. Around the structure are two recently installed pocket parks that include signs explaining the history of steel in Northeast Ohio and how the metal is made.

Drawing on archives at the Western Reserve Historical Society and actual mill artifacts, the exhibits engage visitors with how raw iron ore is turned into finished twenty-ton rolls of steel.

Starting with a HO broken box car that was made into a flat car with real wood decking I added a card-board steel covering, added the ingot molds and using a photo added the years on the side just like the display. (See attached photo of display). I then obtained two old coil cars and repaired them and added the dividers. I used the Walthers Steel Coils and filled them with liquid gravity to add weight to the cars and keep the coils from bouncing around.
