May 7, 2010 7:30 pm

Assistant Superintendent Dale Smith called the meeting to order at 7:30 pm at Hambden Town Hall. Approximately 29 members and 6 guests were present.

Treasurer Bonnie Lette provided the status of the Division financial accounts. All bills are paid and we are financially sound. The money made at Railfest 2010 has been transferred to the Division account.

All Railfest 2010 bills have been paid and an audit can be conducted. Jim Wendorf is working with Lakeland Community College to see if there is any additional space that we can use for Railfest.

Mike Buehner provided the status on the upcoming May layout tours.

Bruce Lutheran and Dale Smith provided an update on the Promo Day 2010 planning. They are asking for volunteers to help with presentations on track laying, basic benchwork framing, scenery, basic layout electrical skills, and plastic kit building as well as others related to building a model railroad layout or module.

Matt Kross and Dale Smith provided an update on the 2011 convention planning. The convention committee met recently. We will be making a convention presentation at this year's MCR convention banquet. This year's MCR convention registration packet will contain a flier for our convention, an early registration form, a call for clinicians, and one of our convention advertising pens. We have a speaker lined up for our convention banquet. It will be Rick Rowlands of the Youngstown Steel Heritage Foundation. The NOARS group is looking at putting together a brief history of each railroad that use to run through northeast Ohio as something to hand out at the convention. We will start our advertising and registration push as soon as this year's MCR convention is over.

Bill Smith was awarded with his NMRA Golden Spike award.

A new HO module group has been started using what is left of the Division 5 modules as a starting point. The modules are stored at Farmpark and there is space there to work on them. If you are interested in getting involved with this group, contact Bruce Lutheran.

May 17, 2010 7:30 pm

A Division 5 BOD meeting was held on May 17, 2010 at Hambden Town Hall. Those in attendance were: Dale Smith, Don Bittner, Mike Buehner, Wayne Lette, Bonnie Lette, Lenny Kessler, Matt Kross, Bruce Lutheran, Dennis Lloyd, and Eric Hansmann.

Election results: **Superintendent** – Mike Buehner, **Assistant Superintendent** – Eric Hansmann, **Treasurer** – Bonnie Lette. 56 out of 95 ballots were received. The BOD certified the election results. The ballots were destroyed.

The new Division 5 Superintendent, Mike Buehner, has selected the following members to serve as **Division Trustees** for the next two years: Dale Smith, Bruce Lutheran, Don Bittner, and Wayne Lette.

Division 5 coordinator changes: Refreshments coordinator is open. Ron Biddell will continue until a replacement is found. Other coordinator positions that are open are for the Company Store, Trip master and Publicity.

The Region is trying to focus on getting more members involved in the NMRA Achievement Program. The BOD discussed the possibility of modifying our Division 5 New Display Award requirements to make it fit the NMRA Golden Spike Award requirements. That way, those that qualify for the Division 5 award will qualify for the Golden Spike award.

A motion was made and passed for the Division 5 BOD to provide a written letter of support to Division 4 with regards to their bid for the NMRA 2014 national convention. We will indicate that we will provide manpower and financial support as well as help to open up layouts, tours, and other activities in our area.

Until a coordinator can be found, Mike Buehner will handle the Division 5 Company Store.

Some financial book keeping issues were discussed regarding our Federal 501(c)3 non-profit status. Our tax return for 2009 was filed. The 2008 tax returned was amended to correct categories for income and expenses. Steve Kaplan has done this for us. Steve is willing to continue assisting us with this in the future, but only if we use a financial tracking system such as QuickBooks or MSMoney. The suggestion is that the Division purchase a laptop and software that the Treasurer will use. It was also suggested that the Railfest finances be maintained in this same program. Bonnie Lette will attempt to enter all the Div 5 2009 expenses into a copy of MSMoney she has to see if that will work for Steve.

The BOD is currently considering purchasing two laptops, one for Railfest and one for the Division Treasurer. Before any purchase is authorized, we need to define the computer requirements and research costs. We believe we can use inexpensive laptop computers in the \$400 to \$600 range. We will wait for information and costs before any action will be taken.

Motion passed to give Steve Kaplan a \$50 certificate for his help with the Division tax forms.


Those that attended the 2010 MCR convention talked about how things went and what ideas we can use for our convention next year.

Bill Smith Receives His NMRA Golden Spike Award.





Do You Qualify For The NMRA Golden Spike Award?

Here are the requirements. They are fairly simple. If you have a home layout, a module, or have worked on sections of the museum layout, you probably qualify.

1. Rolling Stock (Motive Power & Cars):

Display six units of rolling stock either scratch built, craftsman kits or detailed commercial kits.

2. Model Railroad Setting (Structures & Scenery)

Construct a minimum of eight square feet of layout including scenery.

Construct five structures either scratch built, craftsman kits or detailed commercial kits. If a module has less than five structures, additional structures separate from the scene may be presented.

3. Engineering (Civil & Electrical)

Three types of trackage required (e.g. turnout, crossing, crossover, etc.). All must be properly ballasted and installed on proper roadbed. Commercial trackage may be used.

All installed trackage must be properly wired so that two trains can be operated simultaneously (e.g. double track main, single track main with sidings, and block or command control).

Provide one additional electrical feature such as power operated turnouts, signaling, turnout indication, lighted buildings, etc.

NOTES:

Not all of these requirements need to be met on the same layout (or piece of layout). They don't even need to be met in the same scale! If you want to build G scale rolling stock, an N scale Model Railroad setting, and an HO scale layout for trackage and wiring, go ahead.

Also, the Golden Spike, as well as the other parts of the AP have a certain amount of flexibility. For example, suppose you and your (friend / spouse / child) work together on all your projects, but do twice the required amount (12+ units of rolling stock, 16+ square feet of layout, 10+ structures, etc.). You can both be considered, as long as you can show that you have each demonstrated the required skills.

very layout that is heavy into the aggregate industry will have a cement plant or two around the layout. I picked the Walthers Cornerstone cement company for my layout. The top three pictures show the finished Model and the bottom three shows where the model will eventually end up on the layout.

It is a medium size building that occupies a 63 sq. in. footprint. It has eight tall silos and a lot of intricate detail on the roof. The towers and the shed go together quite quickly; it is the roof detail that takes the time. I prefer to paint and weather models as I am putting them together. of the time when you are doing something that you really enjoy? Three name decals come with the model and I chose "Inland Cement Company." 
