

Division 5 BOD Minutes

June 21, 2010

A Division 5 BOD meeting was held on June 21, 2010 at Hambden Town Hall. Those in attendance were: Mike Buehner, Bonnie Lette, Wayne Lette, Don Bittner, Matt Kross, Jim Wendorf, Eric Hansmann, Dale Smith, Bruce Lutheran, and Lenny Kessler.

The audit of the Division 5 financial books through May 31, 2010 has been completed. No problems were found and all accounts balance.

The Division has purchased two laptop computers for use by the Treasurer and the Railfest Chairman. They are two different styles. One cost \$300 and the other \$350. Free Microsoft Office compatible software has been loaded as well as a free anti-virus program. These computers are for Division 5 use only.

A letter was sent to Division 4 from the Division 5 BOD indicating our support for holding the NMRA 2014 National Convention in Cleveland. We understand that Division 4 also received a letter of support from Division 1. Division 4 should know if they won the convention bid shortly after this year's NMRA convention in July. Division 4 sent us a proposal on how to split profits from the convention that would be based on the number of volunteer hours from each division involved.

We are working on completing a survey for the Region regarding the educational resources & needs of our Division.

Lake Metroparks' "Railroads In The Parks" weekend is being moved to the month of June starting in 2011. Andy Baker of Lake Farmpark has invited Division 5 to continue to be a part of this program.

We will revise our Division 5 Display Award form to include information as to what additional items can be added to your display to also qualify you for the NMRA Golden Spike award.

We are again going to offer Division 5 members that are currently receiving a paper copy of the Trainwire an incentive to switch to the electronic version. From now until October 1, 2010, any member that switches from a paper copy to the electronic version will receive a \$5 Division 5 certificate.

The August meeting program will be a focus on the NMRA Achievement Program. Eric Hansmann will review the categories and requirements. He will also begin to show us examples of how he and others have tackled the requirements and filled out their application forms.

Eric Hansmann will now be the AP Coordinator. Bill Brodie will be the Contest Chairman. Dale Smith will be the Tripmaster. We still need members to handle the Company Store, Refreshments, and Publicity.

The current inventory of the Division 5 Company Store was reviewed by the Board. There was some discussion about ways to liquidate our inventory.

Division 5 "Live Steam Picnic" will be held on Sunday, July 25 at the Bleil residence in Mentor from 10 am to dark. Don Bittner will coordinate. Chan Bleil will provide the meat. The Modeler's Corner.








hen modeling an industrial and/or an urban setting, you should consider some sort of power plant. There are many such models on the market, but once again, I chose a Walthers Cornerstone structure, the Northern Light Powerhouse & Substation. These models are two separate kits and were purchased at two separate times. The first two pictures show the finished Power Plant, the next two pictures show the Substation and the last two pictures show where the mod-

els will eventually end up on the layout. The power plant is a medium size building that occupies a 66 sq. in. footprint. It simulated a brick structure complete with smoke stack. Whenever I model a brick structure, I like to paint the brick Mortar joints and I recommend that to be done before adding the windows and the final assembly. Once detailed, the building can be assembled quickly; the substation on the other hand is way more complicated because of the many tiny pieces that have to be individually assembled.







The finished product occupies a 106.25 sq. in. space on the layout. Time was not an important factor on these two models so I can't tell you how long they took to complete, more often than not I am working on several models at the same time. When the scenery is completed, the plant will be sitting in

the bottom of a small valley near a river bank. It will have its own switcher engine and a couple of 34' hopper cars that will be loaded through an operating conveyor in a dumping station. The dumping station will be serviced from the main yard. This is one of my latest projects. What are you working on? If you
