All RR companies had name trains in the passenger era---Broadway Limited, Capitol Limited, Crescent Limited, the Laurentian, Powhatan Arrow, Empire Builder, Hiawatha, just to name a very few. In our imagination---and often in reality—those trains took us to places we had never been before. Little 0-4-0 and 0-6-0 steam engines plved the yard down by the station, and we called them the 'pufferbellies'---all in a row. A fast runner even today is considered to really be 'carrying the mail'. And of course there are many other phrases in our language that speak to that bygone era



November 6, 2015

Meeting was called to order by Superintendent Dave Neff at 7:30 pm at Hambden Town Hall. 30 members and 5 guests were present.

This year's "How To Build A Model Railroad" day was considered to be very successful. Initial attendance estimates were between 150 and 200 people. Next year's event will be November 5, 2016.

After seeing a number of kids at "How To Build A Model Railroad" day, there was some discussion of how to get young people exposed to trains. It was noted that the **NMRA** has decided it is better to focus on people 40 years old or older.

Superintendent Dave Neff met with the new director of Lake Farmpark. The new director is onboard with our December and June setups. For the December Country Lights program at Farmpark, the HO modules will set up on Nov 23 and then be open evenings from Nov 27 to Dec 11. They will need lots of help, especially with the layouts that the kids run. The N-Trak module setup will be Dec 12 and be open Dec 12 to Dec 23. Operating hours are 5 pm to 9 pm.

Reviewed many of **the upcoming events**, most of which were layout tours for Division 4 and Division 5 along with the Youngstown Model Railroad Club open house.

Modeling Question: Methods of insuring your layout / collection. Besides the NMRA sponsored insurance policy, many people said to check your homeowner's insurance about their contents coverage. Many policies cover replacement cost of contents. You need to evaluate your railroad inventory along with all the other home contents as far as total value. One of the big things is to have lots of pictures and a written inventory, if possible. There are also some other insurance companies that provide separate policies for personal collections.

Former member Paul Chapple is moving and has a number of model railroad items for sale and for free.

Chinese Gift Exchange Rules for the Christmas Party

For those people wishing to participate in the Chinese Gift Exchange, bring a **new or unused model railroad related gift** costing approximately \$15 to \$20 to the party. Mark on the gift what scale it is such as "HO", "N", "Any", etc.

Note: Only those bringing a gift may participate!

All those participating will draw a number out of a hat. The person with #1 picks a gift from the table, opens it, and shows it to everyone. The person with #2 can then either pick a gift from the table or take the gift from #1. If he takes the one from #1, then #1 gets to pick another gift from the table. The person with #3 can then either pick a gift from the table or take the gift from either #1 or #2. If someone has their gift taken, they get to pick a new one from the table or take one of the gifts from someone else. They cannot take back the gift that was just taken from them! This continues with each person having the choice of either picking a gift from the table or taking a gift from one of the other participants until everyone has a gift. At the end, the person with #1 then gets to trade their gift with any of the other people. If you want, you can bring more than one gift so that you can get additional picks. It is a lot of fun and everyone is encouraged to participate!

Division 5 Election Process

The following are excerpts from our Division 5 Regulations explaining the election process:

The Division Nominating Committee shall be appointed by the Superintendent. It shall be composed of a Chairperson and two other members. Each person on the committee shall be from a different county of the Division. The current Superintendent shall not serve on the committee, nor sit with it during its deliberations. The Nominating Committee will report the nominations to the Clerk and the membership.

Members of the Nominating Committee may not nominate themselves for any office, including re-election for office.

The Teller shall report the results of the election to the officers of the Division and to all nominees prior to the May meeting. The results are to be announced by the Teller at the May meeting. Those elected shall be invited to participate in the May Board of Directors meeting. The newly elected officers will assume office June 1st.

Nominations for Division 5 offices may be made by a petition signed by two members and the nominee and submitted to the Nominating Committee. The signatures must be legible and the member's NMRA membership number and their membership expiration date must appear with the signature. The petition shall state for what office the candidate is seeking nomination. No candidate can be nominated for more than one office in an election.

Nominations from the Nominating Committee shall be presented at the January meeting of the election year. Nominations of members from the floor shall be presented at the February meeting of the election year. Nominations from the floor shall be by a motion and must be seconded. Nominees cannot nominate themselves.

No member shall be nominated to an elective office without their approval.

Election for Division officers shall be conducted by mail ballot. Nominees for office and qualifications for same shall be included in the March issue of the <u>Trainwire</u> for elected office balloting.

Division 5 2016 Elections

This coming spring will be election time again for Division 5.

There are 2 elected officers in the Division:

- Superintendent
- Assistant Superintendent

Elections are held every two years in the Spring of the even-numbered years. Only Division 5 members may hold office. Terms are two years in length and are limited to 4 consecutive years (two terms) in a row in the same office. If a member has been in a position for two consecutive terms, they can be elected for that position again after they have been out of that position for one term.

If you are interested in running for Superintendent or Assistant, please contact a member of the Division 5 Nominating Committee.

The duties of the Superintendent are:

Preside at all Division 5, Board of Directors, and Executive Committee meetings.

Serve or appoint a proxy as the Division representative on the Region Board of Directors.

Assign the Assistant Superintendent Suitable duties and keep him/her informed of Division 5 business.

Appoint chairpersons of committees required to accomplish the stated purposes of the Division.

Cooperate with other Divisions in every way possible.

The duties of the Assistant Superintendent are:

Assist the Superintendent in any way possible.

Assume the functions of the office of Superintendent during the absence of the Superintendent.

Run the monthly meeting raffle.


Run the Bring & Brag period during the monthly meeting.

ednesday 9/16 was another gorgeous day with bright beautiful blue skies, a few fluffy white clouds and plenty of sunshine. The Econolodge is more like a two star motel, comfortable with a minimal continental breakfast. But this was not a day for crabbing about a crumby breakfast, today was

a day to cross another item off my bucket list, Mount Rushmore. We arrived at the monument around 9:30 am, paid the \$11.00 parking fee and took the long walk down the promenade toward the outstanding carvings. Once you get past the visitors center, the restrooms, gift shops and ice cream stand the stone walkway narrows slightly and has

numerous square columns covered with polished granite. They're all engraved on all four sides with four different States, the date they entered the Union and their state flag flying at the top of their column. In an alcove is a bigger than life-size bust of Gutzon Borglum the architect and main carver of the Rushmore project. After stepping through the final arch-










way, you are on the grand view terrace where you get the best view of the four former presidents overlooking an open air amphitheater with the carvings in the background. After a two hour session of picture taking, we headed southwest to see the Crazy Horse Monument. From the road we were traveling on, George Washington's profile is clearly visible. Twenty-five minutes later we were at the Crazy Horse Memorial. Sad to say, it was a major disappointment because of an exorbitant admission charge of \$11 per person just to step foot on the property. So as Bob turned the truck around as I snapped a few pictures of the impressive stone carving that was started in 1948. Unfortunately, my grandchildren will not live long



enough to see the completion of this self-funded project. No doubt it will be magnificent. We drove through the small town of Custer and headed for Devils Tower. This monument is a huge natural mound that protrudes out of the ground in a place it shouldn't be. The native Indians regarded it as a spiritual site and every day rock



climbers consider it their next challenge. We paid to get into the park and I was able to take pictures from several angles. During our 2 ½ hour visit I was able to film 4 different videos of rock climbers repelling down the 1200 ft. + configuration. Leaving the park, we decide to follow Rt. 51 instead of the freeway



to Gillette Wyoming. That road parallels Rt. 90 and the BNSF rail line where we were sure to find trains, the original reason for making the trip. At the end of a long day, we settled into the Days Inn in Gillette, Wyoming as the sun slowly set.

Thursday 9/17, was another beautiful day, and today we traveled south










on Rt. 59 to try and find the southern tip of the 4 track mainline of the Powder River Basin. Thousands of coal hoppers traverse this short section of rail where the mainline is 4 tracks instead of the usual 3 track mainline. Unfortunately, I was only able to see this interesting section of track at the

Rt. 59 bridge overpass and rail traffic was unusually light. A little disappointed, we traveled south on Rt. 59 and when we got to Bill, Wyoming, I sneezed and completely missed it. Bill is a dot on the map, but it only consists of a motel, general store and a Post Office and if you blinked yours

eyes, you too could miss it. After a quick lunch in Douglas, Wyoming, we headed east to Crawford Nebraska in search of the elusive 2 track back to back double horseshoe curves in the Crawford hills. This interesting piece of engineering is clearly visible from satellite, but 2 two man teams,

approaching from 2 different directions were unable to see this unique piece of track from ground level. Our team found a dirt road that turned into a dust road that turned in a pair of ruts that turned into a cow path that turned into a grass field that only a tractor or heavy duty 4X4 could maneuver. double horseshoe curve it was on to Alliance, Nebraska. FYI the other team, (Dave Hanna and Dale Smith) mistook a large curve in the boondocks as the elusive "double horseshoe". Both teams got skunked. After checking into a used to be "Days Inn" we toured the city of Alliance to see want was there. We





located the BNSF engine repair yard and after a complete tour we were asked *(told)* to leave by a security guard that was from Ohio. The wanta-be Days Inn motel was sub-par by any standards, but all we were looking for was a place to crash. **Tip to travelers**; never book a chain motel that has changed its name.


