Train show April 9th – 10:00 am – 3:30 pm at the Salem Center Plex

Train show put on by the Jefferson Historical Society on July 15th at the Jefferson Community Center – we will have a NMRA table and help is needed for manning it. The LENS group will have their reverse loop layout and the HO Group will have the Kids module

Railfest: Jim passed around the list of workers for the Railfest for everyone to make sure their names were on the list. We had about 4000 attendees, 350 kids. The table sales increased, the gate was up – 2-Day pass we sold 21 and 21 were turned in, there 31 promotional free passes turned in that were handed out by the radio station and other places. The Vendors were very pleased with the show this year. They enjoyed the coffee, donuts and all the help with getting their items in and out of the show. They want to thank everyone for a great show and help. We had new vendors from Detroit area, South Carolina/Georgia area and New York. The Saturday night dinner was fantastic – everyone enjoyed the food and presentation. There were 44 vendors and 6 helpers attended. Tom Pappas gave a great presentation about the Euclid Railroad. Jim W is working on getting Tom Pappas to do another presentation in the future. The vendors were amazed at the progress the Depot is having with the remodeling inside. There is a very big change from last year.

Division 5 BOD Meeting

April 10, 2017

A **Division 5 BOD** meeting was held on April 10, 2017 at Hambden Town Hall. In attendance were Bryan Persing, Bonnie Lette, Wayne Lette, Matt Kross, Don Bittner, Bob Gittinger, and Dale Smith. May Division 5 membership meeting will be in **Erie, PA** on Saturday, May 13.

Railfest 2017 table sales and gate count were up this year. There are still a couple of checks yet to be written to pay for various expenses once invoices are received, so it will be a little while before we have a final financial accounting and can perform the yearly audit.

Grant request by **Lake Shore Modelers** was tabled until the May meeting when the complete set of information can be provided by the Division 5 Superintendent.

Division 5 will be supporting Lake Farmpark personnel with the **Boy Scout Railroading Merit Badge** workshop during the Railroads In The Parks weekend in June. Andy Baker will be leading the workshop for Farmpark and Division 5's Bob Gittinger will be assisting. The workshop will be limited to 25 scouts. Division 5 has purchased screwdrivers, sprue cutters, and Goo from B&B Hobby Supplies to use during the railroad car kit assembly. The Division is purchasing 28 **HO** 50 foot boxcar kits through Stewart's Hobbies for the workshop. The three extra kits are to have on hand during the workshop in case parts are broken or lost. Leftover kits and parts will either be sold or used as door prizes at Railfest 2018.

Dale Smith has talked to a member of Division 1 about putting on a clinic for us sometime in the future.

The Division all day bus trip to **EnterTrainMent Junction** is scheduled for Saturday, August 12. We need to get a count of those planning to go in order to determine the size of the bus we will need. At the moment, we only have 14 people interested.

The **Division 5 picnic** will be held on Saturday, August 5 at the Painesville Depot from 2 pm to 5 pm. We will again use IGA catering.

We have gotten one quote so far for the **defibrillator to be donated** to Hambden Township for installation in the Town Hall. Hambden Fire Department recommended a model that cost \$1200. We are trying to get some other information and recommendations from the American Heart Association. It was suggested that, once we purchase the unit, the Division 5 BOD attend a Hambden Township trustees' meeting and present it to the township.

We have **six layouts** on the list so far for our Fall 2017 layout tours.

Since we have a lot of new members, it was suggested that we put the **instructions for ordering Division 5 apparel** back in the Trainwire for a number of months.

No progress has been made to date on updating our **Division 5 Regulations**. The current goal is to have any changes ready to be voted on in the Spring 2018 ballot.

The next regular Division 5 BOD meeting will be May 8, 2017 at 7:30pm at Hambden Town Hall.

Rails Across the Nation

The California Zephyr

n Thursday around 9 am we boarded the California Zephyr and said good-bye to the West Coast. After the first hour, we were 7000 feet above sea level, high in the impressive Rocky Mountains of California. The climb was slow with curves tight enough

to catch many glimpses of several cars on the train in front and behind us. With bright sunny skies and a few fluffy clouds, these were the most magnificent views so far on the entire trip. Some of the most majestic parts of this spectacular country rest in the Rocky Mountains between San Francisco and Denver. It felt like we were riding on top of the world. This leg of our journey was one

beautiful and peaceful ride through the heavily wooded terrain with its numerous mile long tunnels. It was apparent that a normal camera could not capture the magnificent views that can be absorbed by the eye in the present. Once again we found interesting people who were curious about the card game we were playing and wanted to join in. As the sun slowly set in the Rocky Mountains of









Nevada, we returned to our roomette. We upgraded to a handicapped roomette which is as wide as the entire train car. The beds are just as small, but there was a sink and a toilet accessible in a room with a lot more space. Friday morning we awoke more than half way through Utah. The sun filled sky was bright blue without a cloud to be seen. There were


great mountains in the foreground and interesting rock formations everywhere. Greg and I had breakfast in the room followed by a trip to the lounge car to view the outstanding landscapes. Between Utah and Colorado we passed through three outstanding canyons, one more interesting than the other. Colors and shades of the sheer rock walls

changed with the movement of the train and the position of the sun. The Glenwood Canyon was the most impressive. The train travels on one side of the narrow canyon and I-70 occupies the other side of the canyon, separated by a river.

The terrain on the road side of the canyon is so rugged that the majority of the roadway is suspended on two separate levels, one hell of an engineering feat. One of the last tunnels we went through was the Moffat tunnel before arriving at Denver, Colorado. The tunnel is 6.2 miles long and is 9,239 feet above sea level and takes approximately ten minutes to traverse. Shortly after passing

through the Moffat tunnel, we were able to look down on the mile high city of Denver, Colorado and beyond. I easily concluded that no ordinary camera or embellishment of words can reproduce what your eye experiences in the moment. You really have to be there to fully enjoy the encounter. The train reduced speed and took its time slowly descending down the mountain side. We made a short stop in the Denver Station but not long enough to get out and look

around. I hear that the station is quite ornate. Leaving the Denver station marked the beginning of the end. The country side flattens out and the scenery became blasé not to mention monotonous. Thank goodness for cards and wine. Late Friday night we called it a day in the lounge car and returned to our roomette. It would be the last night we would spend on board in the rocking and rolling bunk beds. It is a wild different way to get a night's sleep,









but manageable. Saturday was a lazy but pleasant day ending in Chicago around 3 pm after being on the train for 51 hrs. and 40 mins. After a 3 ½ hour layover in the Chicago station lounge, we boarded the 30 Capitol Limited bound for Cleveland, Ohio and home. At 1:45 am our trip across the nation by rail, officially came to an end in the Cleveland train station, where it began.

I have always wanted to travel across this beautiful nation by train but never had time during my working career. Once I became handicapped, I thought that dream was dead. Could I possible have made this trip on my own? Maybe, but my son Gregory volunteering to go with me sealed the deal and made sure this old man's dream came true. I thoroughly enjoyed this trip, maybe not the

confusion of Washington State, but seeing a lot of this picturesque country and spending some significant time with my younger son, it was priceless. Would I ever do it again? I can be packed and ready to go in 20 minutes. - The end, for now!




Never too late


