Division 5 Meeting Minutes

June 2, 2017

The June 2, 2017 **membership meeting** was called to order by Superintendent Dave Neff at 8:00 PM at Lake Metroparks Farmpark in Kirtland, OH. 32 members and 4 guests were present.

Superintendent Dave Neff reviewed some of the highlights of the recent MCR BOD meeting held during the MCR regional convention. One of the items was that Bob Orlando was selected posthumously to receive the Russ Wenderfer Award this year. Bob died earlier this year. He was a member of Division 4 but was a regular attendee at Division 5 meetings and events. The award will be presented to his widow by Dave Neff and Steve Kaplan.

Reviewed the upcoming activities for the **Railroads In The Parks** weekend. Division 5 will be assisting with the Boy Scout Railroading merit badge workshop being put on by Farmpark.

The trainshow in Jefferson, Ohio will be on July 15. There will be HO and N layouts. Division 5 will have a membership table and members are asked to help man this table. So far, Dave Neff, Dennis Lloyd, Dan Chuppa, and Tim Clint have volunteered to help.

Tom Pescha reviewed the various upcoming events at **the Painesville Depot**. These are listed on the Depot's website and many of them are listed in the Trainwire.

Dave Neff reminded the membership that **the Marion**, **Ohio Meet** put on by several MCR divisions is coming up in a couple of weeks.

At the recent **MCR BOD meeting**, it was decided to move five counties from Division 11 to Division 5 due to travel difficulties. Division 5 now has the following additional counties: Cattaraugus and Allegany counties in New York, Warren, McKean, and Potter counties in Pennsylvania. The long-term hope is that a new Division 12 can be formed that is made up of these counties along with Erie and Crawford counties in PA and Chautauqua county in NY.

The 2018 MCR regional convention will be in Cincinnati (Division 7) and the 2019 convention will be in Boardman, Ohio (Division 1).

Reminder that the **Division 5 picnic** will be on Saturday, August 5 at the Painesville Depot. The event is free but you need to RSVP to Tom Pescha by July 17 so that we know how much food to get.

We will have our regular monthly meeting on Friday, August 4 at Hambden Town Hall even though the picnic is the following day.

Division 5 BOD Meeting

June 12, 2017

A Division 5 BOD meeting was held on June 12, 2017 at Hambden Town Hall. In attendance were Dave Neff, Bryan Persing, Bonnie Lette, Wayne Lette, Matt Kross, Bob Gittinger, Tom Pescha, Don Bittner, and Dale Smith.

Since Harley Smith was a founding member of Division 5 and did so much for the Division and the NMRA, a memorial article is being prepared to send in to the various model railroading magazines.

Dave Neff went over **the additional counties in NY and PA** that have been added to Division 5 and reiterated that the long-term goal is to have these former Allegheny Highlands Division counties become Division 12 within the Mid Central Region.

Division 5 Company Store sales at the 2017 MCR convention were poor. We only sold 2 N scale reefers.

Reviewed the **status of getting a defibrillator for Hambden Town Hall**. No luck in getting one donated so we are proceeding with purchasing one. The best quote we had has expired. Bryan Persing will get a new quote that has a cabinet included. The BOD instructed Bryan to proceed with purchasing the unit once a new quote was received.

The Division books are ready to be audited at any time. Railfest still has 20 checks outstanding and Jim Wendorf wants to wait until all checks have been posted before doing the Railfest audit.

The August meeting program will be **a hands on soldering clinic**. We need to determine the number of soldering irons that can be safely used in the town hall based on electrical needs.

Need to start reminding **Division coordinators** to start putting their 2018 budget requests together. The BOD will begin working on the 2018 budget at the September BOD meeting.

We have 12 layouts on the list for our **Fall 2017 Division Layout Tours**. We have 8 different dates set aside for the tours. If we have 3 layouts open on each date, we have openings for 24 layouts, so there is plenty of room for more layouts to be added. We will keep advertising in the Trainwire. A cutoff date in early September will be needed so that we have time to put together the layout tour guides.

We only have 14 people signed up so far for the **EnterTrainMent Junction bus trip**. We are looking at getting a smaller bus since there hasn't been much interest shown so far. If we don't get enough people to sign up by mid July, we will have to cancel the trip. The BOD will decide on what the minimum number of signups we need once we select the bus. Bryan Persing will check on other bus companies and what they have as far as smaller buses. We also need to find a place to stop for dinner on the return trip. It will probably be somewhere on the west side of Columbus, Ohio. Matt Kross will send out an e-mail reminder to the membership.

Dale Smith thanked the Division for all their support on the passing of his father, Harley Smith.

Since Harley Smith played such an important role within Division 5, the BOD is looking at some way to perpetuate **the memory of Harley within the Division**. This is just in the beginning stages of discussion but will probably be some type of award presented to Division 5 members under special circumstances for efforts related to something that Harley was known for.

No BOD meeting in July. The next regular Division 5 BOD meeting will be August 14, 2017 at 7:30pm at Hambden Town Hall.
